

Francesco Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice and owns an agricultural enterprise that produces extra virgin olive oil in Sicily.

Arezzo is a graduate of the University of Padua and a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontics associations, as well as the Italian and European lingual orthodontics associations. He is a dentistry graduate of the University of Cagliari, where he also received a master's in lingual orthodontics.

He has served as vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the Ragusa delegation to the National Trust for Italy.

Arezzo is also the owner of an agricultural enterprise and producer of extra virgin olive oil in the Monti Iblei region of Sicily. He has been vice president of the administrative council of the consortium controlling and regulating quality production of oil in that region. He owns two boutique hotel settlements there. He enjoys modern art and opera.

A Rotary member for 36 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, chair of the 2023 Melbourne Convention Committee, learning facilitator, and district conference presidential representative, among other roles.

Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp -A Meaningful Start

The Rotary Club began its service journey for the new Rotary year with a meaningful and impactful project - a Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp at Sushil Kar College Champahati, on 6th July in collaboration with our RCC partner, Champahati BIRD. Led by Dr. Rina Malpani (Project Chair) and supported by Saswati Mukherjee, Sangeeta Bajoria, Anju Bothra, Sandeep Jain, and

young volunteer **Veda Jain**, the camp began with a candle-lighting ceremony, devotional song, and National Anthem. **49 girls were successfully vaccinated**, with Veda assisting cheerfully during the registration process. All beneficiaries received snack packets post-vaccination.

The team also promoted the BOSCH Vocational Training Program at Mallickpur, with 10 youths registering on the spot. Supported by RCC Champahati BIRD members and a BOSCH official, the well-organized camp set a positive tone for the Rotary year ahead.



Free Kidney Health Camp for Firefighters

On **Saturday, 12th July**, a **Kidney Health and Wellness Camp** was held in collaboration with **Vivacity Hospital**, focusing on early detection and lifestyle awareness for our courageous firefighters.

A total of **97 firefighters** benefited from services which included vital checks, kidney and lung screenings, diet consultations, and a wellness talk. Each participant received a **personalized health card** with test results and dietary advice.

The camp promoted early detection and healthy lifestyle habits for our frontline heroes.









Mother & Child Health Camp (MATRI RAKSHA) – 13 July, Malickpur

On 13th July, the Rotary Clubs of Cal Presidency and Salt Lake Metropolitan jointly organized a Mother & Child Health Camp at Malickpur, Baruipur district, under the Global Grant project.

A total of 55 beneficiaries received services. Blood pressure and sugar levels were checked for 50 women, with several new cases of high BP and sugar detected. Dr. Chitra Ray conducted an awareness session on menstrual health and anemia. Free consultations were provided by Drs. Aruna Tantia, Debasmita, Chitra Ray, and Rina Malpani, along with iron, calcium, and deworming medicines. Children were seen by Dr. Sudipta Chandra, and physiotherapy support for joint issues was offered by Dr. Sugato to 30 beneficiaries. Cervical cancer awareness talks were also held.

The Awareness Foundation generously supported the event with the venue and snacks.
