RC Calcutta Presidency, in collaboration with BM Birla Heart Research Centre, is proud to offer free heart surgeries for underprivileged patients. Procedures such as angioplasty, pacemaker implantation, open-heart surgery, and ICD are included under this initiative.

On 1st April, Mr. Rabindranath Ghosh, aged 60, underwent open-heart surgery for two severe blocks in the LAD artery. The operation, performed by Dr. Ratan Das, was done completely free of cost, with the patient paying only ?100 as a registration fee—an otherwise unaffordable ?3 lakh surgery.

Our members Abha Lunía, Sangíta Bajoria, and Dr. Rina Malpani visited him on 4th April, finding him in good health and deeply grateful. His son also appreciated our efforts. A heartfelt thanks to Dr. Ashok Malpani for making this possible. With valid financial documents, we can continue enabling more such life-saving surgeries—a truly noble act of giving someone a second chance at life.

On 19th April 2025, RC Calcutta Presidency partnered in a successful Saksham LN4 Artificial Hand Project camp held in Hooghly District, organized by Rachana Banerjee, Member of Parliament and renowned Tollywood actress. We were honored to serve as the executing partner for this noble initiative.

Out of 12 registered recipients, 9 completed the registration process, and 6 beneficiaries were successfully fitted with LN4 prosthetic hands. One recipient was referred to Dhanbad for further assessment, and two were deemed ineligible due to short stumps. The camp was attended by our dedicated club members, all of whom contributed

to the smooth execution of the project.

The event received strong support and encouragement from Shri Kamnashish Sen, IPS – SP Hooghly, who appreciated the organized fitment, training, and counselling process. The Saksham team's dedication was widely praised, and our hotline number was shared with media outlets to help more recipients access this life-changing opportunity.

This impactful camp also marked a special occasion - the birthday celebration of Rotary International Founder, Paul Harris — making it a truly meaningful tribute.









"Care for the Cancer Patients" – A Touch of Hope

On 3rd April 2025, the Rotary Club of Calcutta Presidency carried out a meaningful initiative titled "Care for the Cancer Patients" at Saroj Gupta Cancer Centre & Research Institute, with a donation of ₹1,06,000.

The project included ₹1,00,000 towards the treatment of S underprivileged patients, and ₹6,000 for 28 silicone pencil pouch stationery kits and 28 foldable cotton utility bags distributed to young cancer patients and their guardians. The entire project was generously funded by our member Rtn Priyanka Gupta, to whom we extend our heartfelt thanks.

The visit began with a briefing on the Institute's history by Dr. Arnab Gupta, followed by a tour of the Children's Care Centre, where gifts were personally handed over to the children present. Gifts for those staying at St. Jude's Institute nearby were delivered to be distributed the next day.

This visit deeply moved our participating members, highlighting the immense need for continued support- especially as over 50% of patients at the institute are treated free or at highly subsidized rates. We look forward to continuing our support for such compassionate causes in the future.

encouraged the students to use their skills to become independent.Mr Barun also shared a few words about the school.

A beautiful fashion show followed, where the beneficiaries proudly showcased the clothes they had made. With help from Sangita 8, Rashi, and Udita, the ramp came alive with colors and smiles. Club members too joined in the ramp walk!

After the show, the students received certificates and sewing machines (through the EIRWT grant). Rtn. Jayshree gave a surprise gift to all beneficiaries, and food packets were distributed to everyone.



Cervical Cancer Vaccine Project by Rotary Club of Calcutta Presidency

On 27th April 2025, the Rotary Club of Calcutta Presidency conducted a Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp at Sushil Kar College, Champahati, for the beneficiaries of RCC Champahati Bird. A total of 84 girls received the HPV vaccine as part of this important health initiative.

The project was held in collaboration with Belur, under Global Grant No. GG#2454823, through which 28 girls aged 9 to 15 years were vaccinated. Additionally, 50 beneficiaries were vaccinated with support from the Serum Foundation, facilitated by our club. The initiative received media coverage by Bangla Republic, raising awareness about the importance of cervical cancer prevention. Our esteemed member, Dr. Rina, addressed the gathering and explained the critical need for early vaccination.

The project was made possible by the generous support of several Rotary members who came forward to sponsor vaccinations. This event showcased the true spirit of service and the strength of our club - always ready to serve.

On 26th April 2025, the Rotary Club of Calcutta Presidency distributed seven sewing machines at the Vocational Training Centre in Baruipur. Several women who have completed or are currently undergoing training at the centre lacked access to sewing machines at home, and purchasing them at market rates was financially unfeasible. To support them, the club applied for the EIRWT Grant (Grant No. 0484) and contributed its share, making the machines available at a highly subsidized price. Thanks to this initiative, these women are now empowered to use their skills to earn a sustainable livelihood from the comfort of their homes.
