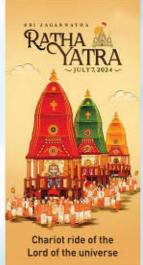

1. Thalassemia Awareness and Detection:

- DGE Dr. Homchaudhri delivered a presentation on preventing Thalassemia.
- NRS Medical College conducted Beta thalassemia detection tests for over 100 students.

2. CPR Training ("DIL KI SUNO"):

CK Birla team conducted CPR training, providing hands-on practice to students.

3. Heart Health Awareness:

- Dr. Pawan Agarwal gave a talk on heart health and cardiac arrest awareness.
- Pamphlets on heart health were distributed to raise awareness among participants.

4. General Health Awareness:

 Dr. U.K. Das spoke about the importance of maintaining good health, emphasizing the adage "Health is Wealth".

5. Donation of Wheelchair:

A wheelchair was donated as part of the initiative to support those in need.

6. Felicitation of Doctors and Chartered Accountants:

- Doctors Dr. Rina Malpani, Dr. Pawan Agarwal, Dr. U.K. Das were honored for their service on Doctors' Day.

July 18th Mother & Child Project -MATRI RAKSHA

We conducted the MATRI RAKSHA, a GLOBAL GRANT PROJECT on 18th July in collaboration with RC Salt lake Metropolitan Club, Kolkata and also involved medical professionals from ILS Hospital.

Activities and Services Provided:

1. Talk by Dr. Rina Malpani:

- · Covered topics such as anaemia, cervical cancer, and menstrual hygiene.
- Discussed healthy food habits.
- Conducted an interactive session on gynaecological problems.
- · Addressed questions and concerns from attendees.

2. Medical Check-up:

- Dr. Poonam and Dr. Rina conducted check-ups for the women.
- Tests included height, weight, haemoglobin levels, blood pressure, and blood sugar.

3. PPH Camp

- Tests were conducted by a team from ILS Hospital, consisting of 4 members.
- Readings and tests included various health metrics relevant to maternal health.

4. Distribution of Supplies:

- · Iron tablets were distributed to address anemia.
- Medicines, Sattu powder (a protein supplement), and Horlicks sachets were also distributed to support nutritional needs of the women.

5. Attendance:

40 women attended the event.

Overall, the MATRI RAKSHA Project provided essential health education, medical check-ups, and necessary supplements to improve maternal and women's health in the community.
