Julius harnessed Rotary's global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks, and make a meaningful impact.

The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies The Magic of Rotary — the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources, and uniting for a common purpose. SAKSHAM 22 FEB. 2025

The Saksham LN4 artificial hand project took place on 22nd February 2025 at Durgapur, in collaboration with Rotary Club Smart City Durgapur 3240. A total of 32 beneficiaries registered, and 30 attended the camp. 27 were fitted with LN4 prosthetic hands, while 3 were declined due to short stumps. Five members from our club- Ranjan, Sangita A, Rina, Rashmi, and Rashi - travelled to Durgapur for the event, which was well-organized and hosted with excellent hospitality. The event featured fitment, training, and counselling sessions for the beneficiaries, who showed great interest in learning how to use the prosthetic hands. The camp was visited by the Mayor and DSP, who were impressed by the impact on the beneficiaries' lives.

Rtn. Ranjan emphasized in his speech that with collective efforts, no person with limb loss should be without access to LN4 prosthetic hands.

In a separate project, our club, in collaboration with Mahavir Seva Sadan, successfully fitted over 80 prosthetic legs over three days. Both projects were a great success, thanks toRtn. Ranjan and Rtn.Sangita Jain for leading them.
