Aandhi Shah was born on 6th November 1954 in London, UK. She was the elder child of late Thakor Shah and late Jyotsna Shah. She did her schooling from Bishop Westcott School in Ranchi and her graduation from M.S. University Baroda. Soon after she came to Kolkata and started working. She started her own business in 1980 and there was no looking back. "The Second Floor", her office was always a hub of activity. She was known for her excellence in her chosen field of vocation (reprographic service).

A Charter member of Rotary Club of Calcutta Victoria (RID 3291), her contribution to the club and to Rotary District is immense. She was Club Secretary twice, first in 1996-97 and a second time in 2015-16.

Her year as President was the year of 'Masti'. The last meeting of every month had a programme that was light hearted and full of fun. Very supportive of youth, she had stressed on programmes for the youth and Interactors and Rotaractors were part of most of the programmes and projects. Some highlights of that year was: A Mock Security Council Assembly with WEBFUNA, held in the august ambience of the Assembly House to commemorate U.N. Day. A night shelter for 300 girl children at Loreto Day School, Sealdah – a matching grant project, was inaugurated. The club received the First prize at the District awards for this noble project. About a 1000 children from 9 schools and 25 challenged children of the Spastics society of Eastern India were taken to Mother Dairy at Dankuni on an educational trip. Her year saw a record number of joint meetings - 9 in all. Work in other areas like Leprosy awareness and detection, Literacy, Low cost shelters, training in yoga and physiotherapy, computer training, projects at RCC etc. continued. Other highlights were Sharad Parikrama – puja hopping with 700 underprivileged children and a sports meet for 600 students of the club's CLE school were organised. "We Are The World", an International event spread over 2 days was organised at Ultadanga.

She was pretty active in the District too and held different posts. District Chairperson, GSE Team Leader, DA and Assistant Governor. As GSETL she had led a team to Australia. GMLs and District Directories were regularly brought out from her establishment. She was an editor of our club for years. Few other Rotary clubs also had their bulletins designed & printed from her office which were highly rated. A dedicated and knowledgeable Rotarian, Rotary was in her blood. Dear Aandhi left for her heavenly abode on 3rd December 2025 leaving behind her younger brother Anil Shah and sister-in-law Rita.

We pray that her soul rests in eternal peace. *Om Shanti!!*
