## **District Governor's Speech**



Dr Krishnendu Gupta AKS welcomed everyone, expressed happiness on the induction of 3 members welcoming them to the Rotary family. He then briefly dwelt on the RIP's theme of the year "Magic of Rotary" and went on to speak about his journey in Rotary. He has joined Rotary in 1993 and was a member of RC Jadavpur but had to leave after an year as he was leaving Kolkata for an assignment in Manipal. On his return it was Late Dr Duru Lilaram RCCB's charter president who brought him into the Rotary fold and he eventually became a member of RCC Victoria. He remembered Late Past Presidents Deepak Atal, Santosh Arora, Nirmla Kohli and especially Dr Joydeep Banerjee whom he introduced to the club, referring to him as his first ever friend in Rotary. He said that they may not be with us today but have left their indelible mark in the club. He also spoke about Aandhi Shah and her contribution to the club. He said he learnt a lot from his President Col MM Burman when he was Club Secretary. After that he became VP and later after nine long years of avoiding the responsibility, he relented after a stern talk by the Colonel and became the President in the year 2017-18, the club's silver jubilee year. He also recognized the contribution of Gayatree Dhar Club Secretary in RY 2017-2018 when he was President. He spoke about the Rotary action plan given by RI President and the significance of the orange colour in the logo which is that of change. Polio has to be eradicated hence funds are needed. # Words of Wisdom



Shri Rahul Das, a technology specialist and passionate about eliminating child labour was the guest speaker at the regular meeting

on Saturday 20th July 2024. With the help of a power point presentation he unveiled the history, method of manufacture, labour dynamics and the pathetic condition of the workers and children in the brick kiln industry in India. Brick making was known from early times from the Harappan Age (2077 BC). In 1870s chimney making process was introduced in the UK. Clay is needed to make bricks. This is obtained from the top layer of the soil by the river bank. It is moulded and fired. They are sun dried. 10% of the entire world production is by India. About 240 billion bricks are produced per year in India. Coal and biomass are used as fuel. This is a very unorganized sector where manual labourers work, mostly seasonal migrants (November to June). Entire families are usually employed in the brick making industry. Though cost of a brick is Rs 13 the workers are paid only Rs 445 per thousand bricks. For them it is a hand to mouth existence. The temporary living conditions that are set up for them are appalling, with no electricity and little water, along with a work schedule of 12 hours. 65-80% of the workers are children. There are about 10,000 kilns in West Bengal. Lack of education, debt bondage, lack of family planning are some of the reasons for their sad condition. It is a vicious cycle. China produces more bricks than India using mechanized manufacturing processes that eliminate child labour. In India, perhaps such a method can be introduced. Some social security, outdoor school for children, vocational training etc. are needed to uplift these workers and their families. Many consumers these days opt for bricks that are child labour free. The talk was an eye opener for many. There was active interaction with members. Rahul Das was introduced by Lata Bhatia, thanked by Arvind Agrawal and presented with a memento by Julie Sen.

Early on Saturday, July 13th, ten Victorians and two Anns headed towards Baruipur Satyananda Vidyapeeth where a couple of projects were to be held. It was a rainy yet pleasant day and the students, teachers and the head of the institute were eagerly waiting for the Rotarians. The projects that were taken up that day were:

Vocational Certificates were given out



to Forty Seven girls for Dress Designing, Tailoring and Beautician Course. These certificates were due from the year 2020-2021 which couldn't be distributed that time due to Covid. The girls informed that they were interested in continuing the course and many more girls were ready to join. Rt. Julie Sen who is also a renowned beautician interacted with them and said that she could help out with the beautician course.

Tree Plantation: Sixty Two saplings were ready to be planted and each Victorian took turn to plant a sapling. The members with the

garden spade in their hands dug the plant beds with lots of enthusiasm and planted saplings of Mangoes, Lemons and Sandal. Sit and Draw Competition: Around Seventy Two children took part in the competition. They were judged in different categories and were given prizes. Rtn. Sunita Agarwala sponsored 90 food packets for all the students. The food packets comprised of Cakes, Biscuits, Instant Noodles and cold drinks for everyone present. The rest of the members present gave them stationery.

Drawing Book, Crayons, Pencil, Eraser, Sharpner and Ruler. The children enjoyed the activity and were very happy.

**Scholarship:** A cheque of Rupees Thirty Thousand was handed over to the head of the institution as scholarship for the students.

The ashram ladies had made delicious lunch for all the members. The children now bid everyone goodbye and thus ended a happy heart fulfilling day.
