of continuity in Rotary. TRF is a very important part of Rotary and India is now the second highest contributor to TRF after USA. About USD 38 million has been given now declared Krishnendu proudly. RID 3291 had contributed over a million dollars to TRF in RY 2024-25, a great feather in our cap. Dr. Krishnendu was a panelist for a session on Annual Giving. It is not often that a sitting DG is a panelist in a RI Convention. A great honour indeed. The session was attended by about 150 people and there was good interaction. All in all our IPDG and Simran had an enjoyable time.
