by their recitation/poetry. Dr. Krish enthralled the members by his piano performance



USHA would be taking their exams on 27th September 2024. All the apparel worn by the students were self made. These women will now start taking orders or will work with master tailors. Another project at the same place was inaugurated. That of Mushroom farming. The initial training was given to the same girls. These girls can start growing mushrooms at home and sell them for some extra money over and above the tailoring.

bags at the end of the month. all the grain was donated to Calcutta Emmanual School to support their mid-day meal programme.


