Hiralal Yadav joined Rotary Club of Hooghly in the year 1995.He served as the President of the Rotary Club of Hooghly in the year 1998-1999 & 1999-2000.He is a past Rotaractor.He graduated from Calcutta University. He is a Ply Wood Manufacturer.

He revived the sick club which was recommended to be closed by the then District Governor.He established Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital in the year 2000 with only eight members in a rented building. The Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital became so popular, that a more spacious building was required.He constructed a well-designed 3 storied building for Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital in the year 2013.Now, Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital is a complete Eye Care Centre and pride of Rotary District 3291. In the last two decades he has helped eighteen clubs in India and two clubs in Bangladesh to establish Eye Hospitals.He is the Chairman of Rotary Hooghly Eye Hospital, Rotary Gangadharpur Eye Hospital & Kuchaikot Rotary Eye Hospital-



Bihar. He is also the Chief advisor/Technical Advisor of 17 Rotary Eye Hospitals.

Presently 55000-60000 surgeries are being done in these Eye Hospitals & 4 lakhs to 4.50 lakhs patients are being treated in the OPD & in Out Reach camps. His dream is to arrange Eye Check-up for 10 lac patients & eye surgeries for 1 lakh patients.

He has served Rotary District 3291 in different capacities and was invited as Guest Speaker in the Training Sessions and Conferences of Rotary District 3250 & 3291.

He is a great supporter of "The Rotary Foundation" & was instrumental in successfully completing 82 Global Grant Projects for different Rotary

Clubs in India, Bangladesh, Singapore & UK. He had made arrangements to construct many tube-wells to provide safe drinking water in the remote villages of Hooghly. He also gave new life to 27 needy children by arranging Heart Surgeries in R.N.Tagore Heart Research – Kolkata & at Narayana Hriduyalaya -Bangalore.He was instrumental in setting up a Primary School at Hooghly Railway station for Underprivileged children in the year 2014.He also supports an orphanage – "Vivekananda Ashram" for the last 23 years. He has worked with District Administration of Hooghly in the implementation of Central Government Development Schemes as Nominated Member of the District Vigilance & Monitoring Committee 2012 to 2019.

He is a Major Donor and recipient of the highest Award of the Rotary International – "Service Above Self Award".

He is married to Deepali. She is an active member of Rotary Club of Hooghly. They are blessed with three daughters & one son.

- under the aegis of Kanthalberia Mahila Suchetana Samiti. Doctors from Dakshin Barasat Eye Hospital checked 60 patients. 13 were detected with cataract. Surgeries





were carried out the next day at the hospital. Free medicines and spectacles were given. Senior RCCV member Dr. OP AGARWAL provided hands on service.

A Second and a Third eye camp were held on 23rd November 2023 and 9th March 2024 respectively at RCC Kanthalberia where (86 + 43) patients were screened. Those detected with cataract (26+8) were operated upon at Dakshin Barasat Eye Hospital free of cost. Free medicines and spectacles given to them. In total 187 villagers screened and 47 surgeries performed in RY 2023-24. Total cost of all three camps Rs: 35650/-



- Medical Camps: (i) A weekly medical camp is held at Bhanru Ramkrishnapur in S-24 Pgs regularly since July 2023. It is an ongoing project. RCCV is sponsoring 2 of the 4 camps per month Cost Rs. 4000/- per month. (ii) Bi-monthly free medical camp started at RCC Brindakhali on 26th January 2024. 20 villagers benefitted. Mother and Child Care Project

On **23rd March 2024**, a Mother and Child project was organised at Srihor near Kamarpukur from 11 am to 5 pm ,with the help of Ramkrishna Sarada Mission Matri Bhavan at their branch there. A team of 6 doctors, 6 nurses and assistants went from Kolkata for the camp. 380 villagers both women and children were checked by GynecologistsandPaediatricians. Free





medicines were given out to them. In addition to this there were 80 eye patients who were also checked by an eye specialist. 5 Victorians attended the camp namely Mukul Mittra, Sukla Mittra, Seema Danda, Sudipta Sen and Gayatree Dhar. The camp was sponsored by RCCV.

WORDS OF WISDOM

On Saturday 16th March 2024 the club welcomed Mrs. Kyoko Hashimoto Govindasamy, a Japanese teacher living in Australia, as a guest speaker. She is also a violin player and a table tennis champion. But she is now into social service.

Way back in 1986 she had come to Shantiniketan to study textile art at the university there on a Government of India grant. She found that quite often the campus had no power and water. Coming from a affluent country like Japan this was quite an eye opener. She learnt to cope and developed different values. During her travel in rural India she found that 23% girls dropped out of school because there was no protection during menstruation. She decided to do something for the girls and women.

Menstruation is not a taboo; it is a health issue. She had thought of

buying pads or mass producing them in a machine and distributing them but decided it would be so much better to get the village women to make them. She spoke to over 5000 school girls over a period of time to understand their problem and ascertain their needs. Girls and boys were always segregated and boys were not allowed to attend the discussions even in co-ed schools, which surprised her. A lady from Mandi, Himachal Pradesh helped her in her effort to find a solution to the problem. A fabric had to be chosen which was a good absorbent, easily washable, dryable and cost effective. Mrs. Kyoko's knowledge about textile art was a great help. She visited dozens of textile hub in India but could not find a suitable fabric for using as inner lining. So she was now getting the fabric from Taiwan made from disposable plastic bottles. She has registered a charity " Hanaru

Ethics Pvt. Ltd." in India for making and marketing these special napkins. These can be washed 250 times and after that instead of incinerating them, can be upcycled and used for road construction. This would vastly reduce carbon emission. The project has multiple benefits girls would go back to school and would be able to do something later in life, rural women would get employment and our environment would be protected. These napkins can be used by senior citizens too who have problem of urine retention. During her talk in various cities where gentlemen were also present she found many men were willing to help. There were lots of queries from members after her illuminating talk.

She was introduced by Varsha Ghatak and thanked by Seema Danda who also presented her with a memento.

LUNGS **OF KOLKATA**

The Lake or Rabindra Sarobar, with its 4 islands and the lush green surroundings, home to a wide range of biodiversity was Non-Existent till about 100 years ago.

The area was a marshland from where soil was excavated to fill tracts of land where Jodhpur Park now stands. The cavernous pit that was formed by the excavation turned into a lake. Initially referred to as Dhakuria Lake, it was renamed as 'Rabindra Sarobar' in 1958 and was conferred the status of a National Lake in 1997. The entire Rabindra Sarobar covering 192 acres has about 11,000 trees of 270 different varieties. It is a delight for bird watchers, nature enthusiasts, morning & evening walkers and elderly people. It is a birder's paradise. A variety of species some rare are spotted here. During excavation of the lake, cannons were found that were probably used in the battle between

Siraj-ud-daulah and Lord Clive in 1756. 3 of the cannons are displayed on a platform on the southern side. A hanging bridge built in 1926 forms a link to one of the islands. Rabindra Sarobar is a harmonious blend of nature, history and urban life.
