Polio Eradication Event on World Polio Day





■ Tues, 24th Oct 2023: The Rotary Club of Calcutta Victoria as a club celebrated World Polio day on 24th October2023 to spread awareness and to eliminate this disease for the future generations. With this in mind we had a Polio Awareness campaign at Ballygunge area. We started from Ward No 8 and put up awareness banners regarding Polio awareness in English and Bengali in strategic places.

We also arranged an Ambulance with a microphone and loud speakers which was used

for propaganda for polio awareness.

This miking program was flagged off by PDG Uttam Ganguly from Ward 8

This was followed by a short talk by PDG Mukul Sinha. From there we drove down in a convoy to Bakul area of Ballygunge and then to densely populated area of Tipu Sultan dome opposite to Kalighat Area.

Ganga Abhiyan



Tues, 31st Oct 2023: Theme Ganga Abhiyan Project (Clean Ganga), was chaired by Rotary Club of Calcutta on 31st October 2023. Many Clubs of District 3291 including Rotary Club of Calcutta Victoria, participated and welcomed British Rotary Club and their delegations from England and Scotland.

The Chief Guest of the programme was Hon'ble Mayor of Calcutta Municipal Corporation, the First Citizen, Mr. Firhad Hakim. Mr. Gautam Chakraborty, who has vast experience in working on cleaning of Ghats, was present at the function.

The flag off was from Outram Ghat and 12 Ghats namely, Goenka Ghat, Mallick Ghat, Banka Choa Ghat, Chotelal Ghat, Ratan Babu Ghat in Baranagar and 3 Ghats in Howrah and Bally, was identified for immediate action.

Advocate Puspali Banerjee, who appeared for the NGOs, to stop solid waste and liquid waste being flunked into Ganga and to pollute the same, expressed her concern, and requested Mayor to take immediate action in the matter.

Words of Wisdom

Vaccination Awareness

Dr Parthajit Das spoke about various vaccinations and their utility at the clubs' regular meeting on 7th October 2023.

Increase in lifespan does not necessarily mean that one has a healthy life. It has been seen that functional cells of the brain along with our immune system declines with age. People over 65 years of age are in a higher risk category. Walking, muscle building exercises have a positive impact on the immune system no doubt, but aged people have lesser response and thus infection can set in with serious problems.

Vaccination is recommended for a healthy old age, said Dr Das. Vaccines are now available for prevention of Influenza, Pneumonia, Hepatitis B and Shingles.

Influenza is caused by virus. There are two types of Influenza, A and B. Yearly vaccination has positive impact on reduction in hospitalization. Invasive pneumonia, caused by Streptococcus bacteria has high mortality rate. There are two types of pneumonia vaccines.

- Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPSV23) which is taken once every 5 years
- Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV13, PCV15 and PCV20). This is given once in a lifetime

Both vaccines taken together provide 90% protection. Vaccination prevents recurring infection especially in COPD patients.

Hepatitis B vaccination is given in three parts (0, 1, 6 months). Shingles or Herpes is a very painful disease and affects one in three persons over 50 years of age. If one has had chickenpox at a young age, the virus lies dormant for 30/40 years in the spinal cord and later travels down the nerve root thus affecting the spine area. Immunodeficiency triggers the dormant

virus into activation. If one is on a lot of medication then one can be vulnerable to scars which can cause psychological and social problems. Nerve pain can be intolerable. Antiviral treatment reduces viral load but it can be a very painful experience.

Shingles vaccination taken in 2 doses (one followed by the second one after 2 months) provides protection from this very painful disease. This vaccination has been strongly recommended by authorities internationally. This is also being widely covered on television.

Dr Parthajit Das was introduced by B K Agarwal, thanked by Mukul Mittra and presented with a token of appreciation by Sachin Nijhawan. The program was sponsored by Glaxo Smithkline Pharmaceuticals Ltd. Mr Kaushik who was present from the company was also given a token of appreciation by Sachin Nijhawan.
