




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


Twenty-five years ago, thousands of children in Africa were paralysed by the Polio virus. This August 2020, Africa has been declared free of wild polio.

The disease is now found only in Afghanistan and Pakistan. This milestone is an incredible public health achievement for Rotary members, the African region, and the GPEI partners, and a huge step forward on the road to global polio eradication. But it is important to remain vigilant and avoid complacency until there is global eradication because if a country lets down its defence by failing to vaccinate, then wild polio can once again begin to spread quickly.

For all types of polio to be eliminated, including vaccine-derived polio, vaccination efforts will need to continue alongside surveillance, to protect children from being paralysed by the disease in the future.

Rotararctors are encouragd by RI Trustee in giving to foundation. So if 5 rotaracctors give \$50 then this certificate can be given to the Rotaract club.

Rotaract is now a type of Rotary Membership. Rotaract will be open to all young adults 18 and over. There will no longer be an upper age limit of 30. In 2022.Rotaractors will pay annual per capita dues of either \$5 (institution based) or \$8 (community based). Rotary clubs should continue to work with Rotaractors at meetings and events, and in service projects of the clubs.
