The Bengali Language Movement, also known as the Language Movement ভাষা আন্দোলন was a political movement in former East Bengal (today Bangladesh) advocating the recognition of the Bengali as an official language of the then-Dominion of Pakistan in order to allow its use in government affairs, the continuation of its use as a medium of education, its use in media, currency and stamps, and to maintain its writing in the Bengali script. . In 1948, the Government of the Dominion of Pakistan ordained Urdu as the sole national language, sparking extensive protests among the Bengali-speaking majority of East Bengal. Facing rising sectarian tensions and mass discontent with the new law, the government outlawed public meetings and rallies. The students of the University of Dhaka and other political activists defied the law and organized a protest on 21 February 1952. The movement reached its climax when police killed student demonstrators on that day Abdus Salam, Rafig Uddin Ahmed, Abul Barkat and Abdul Jabbar were killed in police firing. The deaths provoked widespread civil unrest. After years of conflict, the Pakistan government relented and granted official status to the Bengali language in 1956. The Language Movement catalyzed the assertion of Bengali national identity in East Bengal and became a forerunner to Bengali nationalist movements, including the 6-Point Movement and subsequently the Bangladesh Liberation War and Indo-Pakistani War of 1971 and Subsequently the birth of new Nation Bangladesh
