

15th August, 2025



As part of the event, **Mrs. Vidyalakshmi Shetty**, NSS Officer, provided an insightful brief on the objectives of *Parisara Maitri*. She explained how the initiative connects the celebration of independence with ecological responsibility, aiming to instil the habit of tree planting and care among students.

18th August , 2025

Rotary Mangalore Downtown in association with Primary Health Centre, Kotekar and Yenapoya Medical College conducted a "Women's Cancer Awareness and Screening Camp" at Kotekar Primary Health Centre on 18th August 2025 from morning 09.00AM to afternoon 03.00PM. During the medical camp, tests for B.P., Diabetes, Mammography, Pap smear test, Dental and Oral cancer check up were carried out. The project was coordinated by our member Rtn Dr Savitha Gatty. Our member Rtn Umesh Gatty was also attended the inauguration of the medical camp.

During the camp 42 women received general health check-ups, necessary treatments, oral examinations and clinical breast examinations and counselling. Among them, 32 women underwent Pap smear screening to detect cervical abnormalities. Additionally, participants received blood pressure checks and glucose monitoring, along with serology tests.








Festival to be held at France from 13th to 21st September, 2025. 'Tulunadu Chariot' is 18 Ft high and 10 Ft wide.

'Tulunadu chariot' is unique to the Tulu-speaking coastal belt. The colourful chariot will be a new attraction at the festival in which people from 50 countries are expected to participate.

Another kite 'Water is Life' has been designed in such a way to communicate the message to treat water like God. Hence, in the design, a pot of water is placed inside the "pallakki" (palanquin) used to carry idols in temples. In addition, the design shows the sky and greenery (on the tile part).

SangKoo Yun resigns as 2026-27 Rotary International President

Dear Rotary Leaders,

As you may recall, last April, President-elect SangKoo Yun informed us all of his diagnosis of pancreatic cancer and his decision to step back from Rotary responsibilities so he could focus on his treatment. Today, President-elect SangKoo notified me in a letter that he has decided to resign as President-elect of Rotary International after extensive consultation with his doctors. In his message, he shared the following sentiments:



"My doctors have advised that it may not be possible for me to meet the demanding travel and schedule required of our President. As much as I wish to serve in this role, I must honor that advice."

"It has been a tremendous honor and pleasure to be given the opportunity to lead our organization. I will continue to serve however I can, and my love for Rotary and my commitment to our mission remains unshaken."

On behalf of the Rotary International Board and with a heavy heart, I accepted SangKoo's resignation. While it is a difficult decision, we deeply appreciate SangKoo's thoughtful consideration and his focus on the best interest of Rotary.

The Board will convene soon to determine next steps. We will keep you updated on any further developments.

I want to thank SangKoo for his tremendous service, leadership and contributions to our organization. Please join me in wishing him a swift recovery and good health in the future.

Olayinka Hakeem Babalola selected to be Rotary International President for 2026-27



Olayinka Hakeem Babalola, a member of the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi, Nigeria, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2026-27. His term will begin on 1 July 2026.

The Board, guided by the RI code of policies, conducted a special session to select the organization's leader after the resignation of RI President-elect SangKoo Yun, who decided to step back from his Rotary responsibilities and focus on his recovery from recent cancer treatment.

Babalola began his Rotary journey in 1988 as a Rotaractor. Later joined the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi in 1994. His leadership roles include serving as district governor (2011-12), RI vice president (2019-20), and member of the RI Board (2018-20). He was also an active leader and participant in RI committees such as the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee (2017-23) and the Nigeria National PolioPlus Committee (2013-present, adviser 2016-present).

Babalola is an Engineering Graduate. He has worked for 25 years in the oil and gas industry, holding senior positions in Shell PLC and carrying out projects on four continents. He is the founder of two companies: Riviera Services Ltd., an oil and gas infrastructure delivery company, and Lead and Change Consulting, an executive coaching and organizational performance advisory group. Babalola's professional affiliations include the Nigerian Society of Engineers, the Institute of Safety Professionals, and the Association of Change Management Practitioners. He is a member of Jericho Business Club, an organization in his home city that provides input to governments on economic and social policy.

Babalola is married to Preba and live in the city of Port Harcourt. He supports The Rotary Foundation with a named endowment and as an Arch Klumph Society member. A trustee of ShelterBox UK and director of the Safe Blood Africa project, he is a recipient of the Africa Centennial Heroes Award, the Regional Service Award for a Polio-Free World, the RI Service Above Self Award, and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service.



Rtn Larry A. Lunsford selected to be 2027-28 Rotary International president

Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.



A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies. He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.

Lunsford joined the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza in 1991 and has since served as District Governor (2001-02), RI Director (2013-15), and Trustee of The Rotary Foundation (2021-25, Vice Chair 2024-25). He has been a member of RI committees, including the Executive Committee (chair 2014-15), Membership Growth Committee (chair 2016-18), and Nominating Committee for President of RI (chair 2023-24). He also has served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (chair 2023-24), Finance Committee (chair 2022-23 and 2024-25), and Participant Experience Committee (chair 2023-24).

Lunsford has been awarded The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award, The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service, and the RI Service Above Self Award. He and his wife, Jill Lunsford, have two children and one grandchild. They are Major Donors, Bequest Society members, Multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and Sustaining Members. Rotary

Mann's works influenced and inspired many notable writers.




RTN THOMAS MANN

Rotary's original philosophy, as conceived by Paul Harris, was based on a unique balance between community service and professional networking.

The central idea was to create a space where businessmen and professionals could build friendly relationships while helping each other in their respective activities.

Paul Harris firmly believed these personal that connections would foster stronger business ethics and a greater sense of social responsibility.

The pioneers of Rotary thus placed the concept service at the heart of their project.



Rather than limiting themselves to the sole pursuit of profit, they intended to put their skills and resources at the service of the common good, thus contributing to the improvement of life in their respective cities.


The concept of "Service Above Self" was not yet formalized, but the idea of contributing to the well-being of the community was already present.

The weekly meetings, alternating between members' workplaces, aimed to promote mutual understanding of different professions and encourage ethical business exchanges.

Enhancing Basic Education skills and Literacy are essential in reducing

poverty, improving health, encouraging community and economic development, and promoting peace. Improvements can reduce maternal death, improve childhood survivability, and reduce poverty. They can also enable success in business or a profession.

Projects undertaken by a Rotary Club can address low adult literacy, returning youth to school, enhancing student performance, or supplementing limited school resources.

Worldwide, 67 million children have no access to education, and over 775 million people over 15 are illiterate. I am glad that our members support educational projects. Our goal is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity and increase adult literacy.

Education for girls: If you want to empower societies, reduce poverty, improve basic hygiene and healthcare and fight high infant and maternal mortality rates, the answer is to educate girls. 



It is an adventure filled event with fellowship, fun, thrill, purpose and supporting Rotary's mission of 'Service Above Self'.


