

## “SAMVEDA #40 – EFFECTIVE PUBLIC SPEAKING”




**4<sup>th</sup> December , 2025**

# United Nations and Rotary celebrate 80th anniversary of UN charter



Rotary International and the United Nations reaffirmed their historic partnership during the 80th anniversary of the UN Charter signing.

Leaders from both organizations recalled how,

in the aftermath of World War II, Rotary helped shape the UN by serving as observers at the 1945 Charter Conference, contributing to agendas, resolutions, and mediation efforts.

Speakers emphasized that global cooperation is more vital than ever as the world faces conflicts, inequality, climate change, and technological risks.

Despite challenges to multilateralism, progress offers hope: education access has expanded, poverty has declined, and health outcomes have improved worldwide. UN leaders stressed that such achievements result from sustained collective action.

Rotary's grassroots initiatives align closely with UN agencies in education, health, peacebuilding, environmental protection, and the fight against polio. The enduring Rotary-UN relationship reflects a shared belief that peace is built through cooperation, service, and the everyday commitment of individuals choosing unity over division.



**ROTARY HISTORY TIMELINE CARDS (RH#002)**

**1906** — Members agree to be on a "first name" basis. Singing introduced by Harry Ruggles in part to lighten up the serious atmosphere.

Wagon wheel emblem adopted, the first of many variations of the "wheel emblems" to be used by different clubs, until 1912, when a geared wheel was adopted.

The official emblem was authorized in 1924—a wheel of six spokes, 24 cogs and a keyway.



## ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR 2027-2029





He will be at the inauguration of our District Conference 'Sneha Sourabha' at Mysuru on 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2026.


## CHAIR OF POLIO OVERSIGHT BOARD (POB)

## JANUARY – VOCATIONAL SERVICE MONTH



January is Vocational Service Month in Rotary, a time to focus on high ethical standards, recognizing the worthiness of all occupations, and using members' professional skills to serve the community, rooted in Rotary's principle of using one's profession as an opportunity to serve society. Rotarians use this month to promote integrity, learn about each other's careers, and apply their expertise in service projects.

### Key aspects of Vocational Service Month:

- **Core Principle:** It highlights one of Rotary's five Avenues of Service (Club, Community, International, Youth, and Vocational).
- **Ethical Focus:** Adherence to and promotion of the highest ethical standards in all occupations, including fair treatment of employers, employees, associates, competitors, and the public, guided by The Four-Way Test.
- **Professional Application:** Members share their skills (medicine, tech, business, etc.) to help communities and mentor youth.
- **Dignifying Work:** Promotes the idea that every useful occupation is an opportunity to serve. The recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, not just those that are pursued by Rotarians.

Then two hotels, then three hotels, then hotels abroad –



- 2) Earlier it was between 18 to 30 Years. However, at present there is no upper age limit.
- 3) A Rotary Youth program for post primary school students.
- 4) Between the age of 12 to 18 years.
- 5) The Interact Club of Melbourne High School, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Melbourne, Florida, USA, became the first Interact club on 5<sup>th</sup> November 1962.
