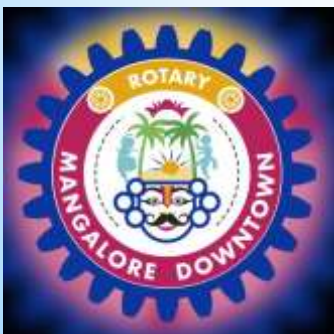

## “INSTALLATION OF OVERHEAD WATER TANK AT ANGANWADI”

A conducive environment with adequate facilities is essential for ensuring a meaningful and enriching learning experience for children. Among these, access to safe drinking water and proper hygiene facilities are fundamental necessities that contribute significantly to the health and well-being of young learners.

Recognizing this important need, when the Gandhinagar Anganwadi approached us with a request for a 1000-litre overhead water storage tank, we responded promptly. The water tank was successfully installed on 4th May 2026, ensuring a reliable supply of clean water for the children and staff of the Anganwadi. The total cost of the project was Rs.15,000/-, out of which our generous and large-hearted Rotarian, Suraj Hebbar Neria, graciously contributed Rs.10,000/- towards the initiative.

## “ROTARY EXTENDS HELPING HAND TO ACCIDENT VICTIM”



**12<sup>th</sup> May, 2026**

Shri Vijay Kamath, aged 52, from Mangalore, who is unmarried and earns his livelihood by running a line sale business of snacks along with a small grocery shop. On 19th April 2026, while returning from Hebri, he met with a severe accident and sustained serious injuries to his head, face, and right hand, which unfortunately had to be amputated. Presently, undergoing treatment at Adarsha Hospital, Udupi. As on 29th April, his hospitalisation expenses had reached approximately Rs. 6.65 lakhs. While he has health insurance coverage of Rs. 1 lakh, the remaining amount has to be borne by the family. In addition, he is expected to undergo another surgery in the coming months. With the unfortunate amputation, his source of livelihood has also come to a halt.

The family approached us seeking support during this difficult time. Responding promptly to the appeal, our club members came together and generously contributed a sum of Rs. 55,000/- towards his medical expenses. The cheque was handed over to Shri Deepak Kamath during our weekly meeting held on 12th May 2026.

## The ABCs of Rotary



### Definition of Rotary

How do you describe the organization called "Rotary"? There are so many characteristics of a Rotary club as well as the activities of a million Rotarians. There are the features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people and many more.

In 1976 the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested in creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on Rotary's Public Relations Committee and requested that a one-sentence definition of Rotary be prepared. After numerous drafts, the committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications:

**"Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world."**

Those 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks, "What is a Rotary club?"

## RTN. COL. HARLAND SANDERS

**Harland Sanders** was born in 1890 in the little town of Henryville in southern Indiana. The “colonel” was given to him in 1935 as an honorary title by the governor of Kentucky in recognition of his accomplishments, and ever afterward everyone called him “The Colonel”.

In 1930, in the small rural town of Corbin, Kentucky, he opened up

“**Sanders Cafe**” in a corner of the gas station. The fried chicken Sanders prepared was such a big hit with the customers that every day there was a long queue in front of the store waiting to be served. That was the beginning of what developed into the world’s largest fast food chain Kentucky Fried Chicken (KFC). Rtn Sanders had been an active Rotarian since 1919 when he became a founder member of the Rotary Club of Jeffersonville, Indiana, at the age of 29. After that he joined the Rotary Club of Corbin and then the Rotary Club of Shelbyville, and was an active member until 1980 till his death. Colonel Harland Sanders was one person who truly lived the Rotary motto “**He profits most who serves best**”.

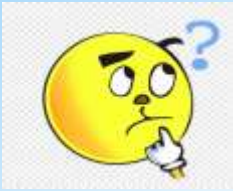

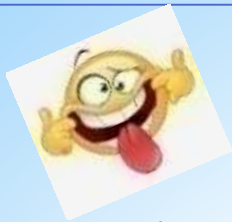
## JUNE – FELLOWSHIP MONTH

## SHOWCASING OF ROTARY AT WORLD CUP FOOTBALL- 2026

Wing-Kai To grew up watching international soccer and idolizing its stars. As a child in Hong Kong, he followed players like Pelé, Franz Beckenbauer, Johan Cruyff, and Diego Maradona.

Now living in the United States, To is a member of the Rotary Club of The Bridgewater, Massachusetts, USA, and no less enthusiastic about international soccer. He hopes he'll be selected as one of hundreds of volunteers when the **2026 FIFA World Cup** comes to Gillette Stadium near Boston.

“I will be excited to take on one of the two dozen roles supporting the tournament,” says To, a professor of history at Bridgewater State University. “I have already secured tickets to the match between Scotland and Morocco and am getting ready to cheer for both teams.”

The World Cup, the most-watched sporting event in the world, will be hosted by three countries for the first time. 48 teams will play from 11 June to 19 July across 16 cities in Canada, Mexico, and the United States. In Canada, those areas are Toronto and Vancouver. In Mexico, they are Guadalajara, Mexico City, and Monterrey. And in the U.S., they are Atlanta, Boston, Dallas, Houston, Kansas City, Los Angeles, Miami, New York/New Jersey, Philadelphia, San Francisco, and Seattle.

The games provide a unique opportunity for Rotary clubs to offer hospitality and promote Rotary’s work on the global stage.

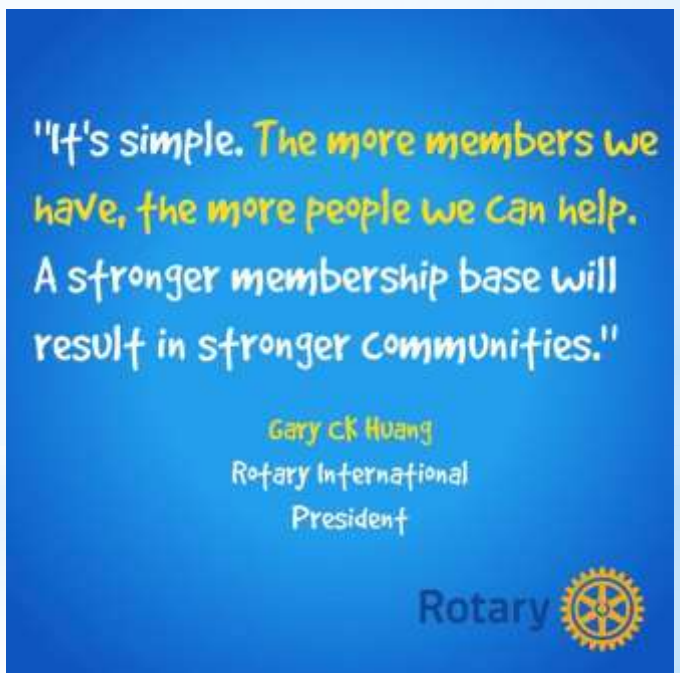
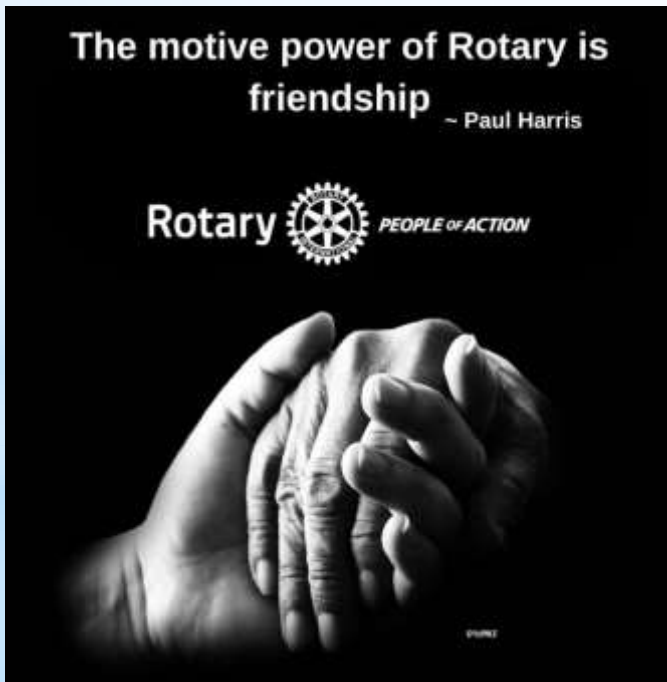
