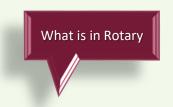

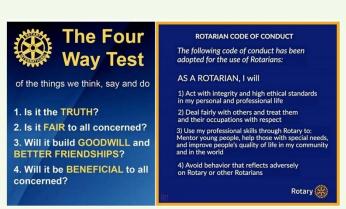

Took place in the vibrant city of Delhi across the iconic Yashobhoomi Convention Centre and the historic Manekshaw Centre from 14th November to 16th November 2025, this event was a significant gathering for Rotarians from Zones 4, 5, 6, and 7.

Governor Elect Learning Seminar(GELS) & Governor Nominee Learning Seminar(GNLS) was held from 11 to 13 November. From 14 to 16 November 2025, CSR Award, TRF Seminar, AKS Induction programmes were held. Renowned speakers and guests were there to enrich the gathering.



This month's special issue of Rotary magazine is all about happiness, that most elemental of human yearnings. More than a feeling, though, this state of positive well-being, and the conditions necessary to create and sustain it, should be considered a universal right.

December also marks Rotary's Disease Prevention and Treatment Month, when we highlight our members' work to

promote health and wellness, including mental wellness. Globally, nearly 1 in 7 people have a mental health disorder, according to a recent World Health Organization report. Yet only 9 percent of people with depression receive adequate treatment.

We are fortunate in Rotary to have a powerful way to support emotional well-being and happiness: friendship. The connections we build in Rotary can be a powerful force for change. I know this from personal experience.

When my fellow members first proposed that I become club president, I demurred. I had a stutter. I was terrified of speaking. But having club members who supported me and surrounded me with affection enabled me to face my fear, and I found a way to stand confidently before a crowd.

Today, I regularly address audiences — some numbering in the thousands — in a language that is not native to me. The Rotary members in my life helped me create lasting change within myself.

That fellowship gives us the courage and means to create lasting change in the world as well, and mental health services are in desperate need of improvement. The WHO reports that governments on average devote only 2 percent of their health budgets to mental health, and only 11 percent of that funding reaches community-based services. In some countries, only one trained mental health professional is available for every 100,000 people. The WHO has called for strategic and urgent action to close the gap.

Rotary can answer that call by championing mental health awareness in our clubs, working with local health systems, funding training for community health workers, and supporting initiatives that bring care to places where none exists. Even small investments in mental health yield enormous returns in productivity, public health, and happiness.

While we are creating lasting change in the world, we cannot forget to take care of each other. Past RI President Gordon McInally wisely reminds us that we must go beyond asking, "How are you?" We owe it to each other to instead ask, "How are you really?"

As we transition to a new year filled with new possibilities, let us Unite for Good - for healing, friendship, and access to happiness.

Activities and Focus Areas

Peace Fellows

Peace Fellows: The process

Rotary Peace Fellows study disciplines related to peace and development at one of Rotary's partner universities. The process by which Rotary selects peace fellows is rigorous. Rotary and Rotaract members can identify possible fellowship candidates in their social and professional networks, nearby universities, local governments, and non-governmental organizations. Members can send potential candidates information about the program using this referral form.

Rotary and Rotaract clubs can also work with their district Rotary Peace Fellowship subcommittee chairs or district Rotary Foundation chairs to recruit and recommend candidates. Learn about candidate eligibility and qualifications. Applicants should be early- or mid-career professionals with peace and development expertise and potential for future growth and impact as leaders in the field.

Candidates must complete an online application. To learn more about Rotary and get help with the application process, they can use the Club Finder tool to connect with a local or online club. Candidates are required to be proficient in English, have bachelor's degrees, and meet other requirements.

Rotary International staff members, trained Rotary members and alumni, and university partners review fellowship applications. The review teams look for eligible candidates who have relevant experience and demonstrate a commitment to peace and development, leadership and impact potential, academic achievement, and other qualities. Rotary peace center committee members and university partners select the finalists, who are then referred to trustees of The Rotary Foundation for approval.

Fellowships cover tuition and fees at a Rotary Peace Center along with room and board, round-trip transportation, and internship and field study expenses.

Rotary for you

Rotary Action Groups are independent, Rotary-affiliated groups made up of people from around the world who are experts in a particular field, such as economic development, peace, addiction prevention, the environment, or water.

Action groups offer their technical expertise and support to help clubs plan and implement projects to increase our impact, one of Rotary's strategic priorities. This support includes helping clubs find partners, funding, and other resources. Action groups can also help clubs and districts prepare grant applications, conduct community assessments, and develop plans to monitor and evaluate their projects.

Anyone who wants to share their expertise to make a positive difference can join an action group. Only Rotarians, Rotaractors, and Rotary Peace Fellows can serve in leadership roles.

Introduction

Rotary Action Groups are international Rotary-affiliated groups whose members have subject-expertise and/or experience in a particular area of specialization. They use their knowledge, passion, and global network to support Rotary and Rotaract clubs, districts, and multidistricts in planning and implementing impactful humanitarian service projects. By bringing expertise, partners, funding resources and best practices to projects, they help clubs scale up smaller projects to larger, higher impact, more sustainable initiatives.

Historical Background

The Rotary Action Groups program was created in 2005 when service-oriented Rotary Fellowships, consisting of members with subject-matter expertise, distinguished themselves from hobby and vocationally networking-focused Rotary Fellowships. The Rotary International Board of Directors created governing policies for Rotary Action Groups, which defined the purpose of these groups and their relationship with Rotary International and volunteers. When the Rotary Action Groups program was first created, groups were expected to develop and implement their own international signature programs. While the majority of action groups provide technical consultation on club and district-led service initiatives today, some groups still implement a signature program and focus their efforts on scaling that program.

National Immunization Day



India has been polio free for more than 14 years. While the polio free certification of India on 27 th March 2014 is a commendable accomplishment, transmission of wild polio virus continues to effect globally, including in some of India's neighboring countries, raising the risk of disease importation. To maintain polio free status and as per recommendations of the India Expert Advisory Group on polio, National Immunization Day (NID) is to be conducted covering children upto the age group 0 - 5 years. In this regard it is decided to conduct NID for Polio on 21 st December 2025 using bivalent Oral Polio vaccine.
