



Chesley R. Perry: Rotary's first general secretary

"Builder of Rotary International"

Chesley Reynolds Perry, a Spanish-American War veteran and former Chicago Public Library employee, served as Rotary's first secretary and is known as "the builder of Rotary International."

While Rotary's president changes every year, only 12 people have served as general secretary, a role that's equivalent to a chief executive — and at 32 years, Perry served the longest.

In August 1910, the newly formed National Association of Rotary Clubs (now Rotary International) unanimously selected Perry for the role then known as secretary. He accepted the part-time position at \$100 per month, with an agreement that the amount of time he'd devote would remain unspecified. By 1912, the job had evolved into a full-time executive role, and Perry's pay was increased.

Perry's own office on LaSalle Street in Chicago, Illinois, USA, served as the first headquarters of the association. By 1911, Rotary had established an office in the First National Bank Building at the intersection of Dearborn and Monroe in Chicago.

Perry concurrently served as editor and business manager of *The Rotarian* from 1911 to 1928, and he opened Rotary's first international office, in Zurich, Switzerland, in February 1925. He oversaw the expansion of Rotary as it grew during his tenure from 16 clubs in the United States to more than 5,000 worldwide. His title was officially changed to general secretary in 1941-42, his final year in office.

Perry had announced his plans to retire in 1940, but agreed to remain in his post while the organization trained his successor, Philip C. Lovejoy. A number of clubs sought to nominate Perry for RI president in 1942-43, but he declined, saying, "I am gratefully conscious of the high compliment thereby being paid to me."

After retiring, Perry remained a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago, which he'd joined in 1908. But he wasn't done being a leader, and served as club president in 1944-45. In 1954, Rotary offered him the title "secretary emeritus" to honor his years of service, but he again declined, preferring the role of ordinary Rotarian. Perry died on 21 February 1960 at the age of 87.


Annette Riya D/O Rtn Prakash Puttur won silver medal at District athletic meet held at Puttur on 7th Dec 2025

Rotary's Relationship with the United Nations Creation



Rotary International has had a close relationship with the creation of the United Nations (UN) since its inception.. In 1942, during World War II, Rotary International President Clem Renouf convened a meeting in London with Rotary leaders from around the world to discuss the possibility of creating an international organization that would promote peace and cooperation between nations.

The Charter Of The United Nations

In 1945, after the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, Rotary leaders from around the world met at the Rotary World Convention in San Francisco, California to discuss the

creation of the United Nations. At this convention, a resolution urging the creation of an international organization that would promote peace and security in the world was adopted.

The resolution was introduced by Rotary delegate Paul Harris, who later became Rotary International's first president.. The resolution was adopted unanimously and became the basis for the creation of the United Nations.

The United Nations Visit

Each year, Rotary International organizes a visit to the United Nations in New York, where Rotary leaders from around the world meet with UN officials to discuss issues of common interest, such as peace, security, sustainable development and the eradication of poverty.

During the visit, Rotary leaders meet with the UN Secretary-General and other high-level officials to discuss cooperation between Rotary and the UN on projects and programmes that benefit humanity.

***The History of the Past ***

Rotary's relationship with the creation of the United Nations dates back to World War I, when Rotary founder Paul Harris met with leaders from other countries to discuss the possibility of creating an international organization that would promote peace and cooperation among the nations. nations.

In 1915, Harris traveled to Europe to meet with Rotary leaders from other countries and discuss the possibility of creating an international organization that would promote peace and cooperation. This meeting became the precursor to the League of Nations, which later became the United Nations.

Rotary's contribution to the United Nations

Rotary has contributed significantly to the creation and development of the United Nations. Some of the most notable accomplishments include:

- The creation of the Charter of the United Nations, which was introduced by Rotary at the 1945 World Convention.
- Rotary's participation in the San Francisco Conference, which adopted the Charter of the United Nations.
- The creation of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), which has worked with Rotary on sustainable development projects around the world.
- Rotary's participation in the 1992 Earth Summit, which adopted Agenda 21, an action plan for sustainable development in the 21st century.

Conclusion

Over the years, Rotary has contributed significantly to the creation and development of the United Nations, and continues to work with the UN on projects and programmes that benefit humanity.

Donors to The Rotary Foundation celebrated some big achievements in fundraising in the past year, showing their support for the wide array of programs the organization sponsors all over the world.

A multiyear campaign to increase the Endowment to US\$2.025 billion by 2025 exceeded its goal by US\$25 million. In 2024-25 alone, members and others contributed more than half a billion dollars to the Foundation.

"The goal was an inspiration, but the objective was to do good in the world," says Mark Daniel Maloney, the 2024-25 Rotary Foundation trustee chair. "We are making sure that Rotary will always be able to carry out that mission."

The Foundation raised more than US\$569 million in 2024-25 alone, exceeding its annual goal by almost US\$70 million. More than 478,000 individuals donated, along with over 31,000 Rotary clubs and nearly 1,900 Rotaract clubs.

Thanks to its donors, the Foundation was able to award 1,424 global grants, 468 district grants, and 74 disaster response grants in the past year. A US\$2 million Programs of Scale grant will help build peace and economic independence in Colombia. Rotary International also extended its long-standing partnership with the Gates Foundation, announcing a joint commitment of up to US\$450 million over three years to support global polio eradication efforts.

"Rotary members demonstrated their commitment to these efforts with their support of the 2.025 by 2025 campaign," Maloney says. In particular, he notes the large number of fundraising events around the world that Rotary's district governors organized.

"I am just amazed at the generosity of Rotary members," he says. "They came together to make it happen."

The Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) announced that Rtn Michael (Mike) McGovern, Chair of the International PolioPlus Committee, Rotary International, will serve as the next Chair of the Polio Oversight Board (POB), effective January 1, 2026.

After five years of dedicated service as the GPEI's POB Chair, Dr. Chris Elias, President of Global Development, Gates Foundation, will hand over the role. Mr. McGovern brings decades of experience and passion for polio eradication, and we look forward to his guidance as we accelerate efforts toward a polio-free world. In 1985, Rotary International launched the global effort to end polio, and Rotarians around the world have been at the heart of the effort since.

"I am humbled to take on this role and build on the incredible work of Dr. Elias and the GPEI partners. Together, we can end polio once and for all," said Mike McGovern.


### **About Michael K. McGovern**

Mike McGovern has chaired the Rotary International PolioPlus Committee since October 2014. He has represented Rotary on the Polio Oversight Board since 2018 and formerly chaired its Finance Accountability Committee. He made his first financial contribution for polio eradication in 1988.


He joined Rotary in 1986 as a member of the Rotary Club of South Portland-Cape Elizabeth, Maine, USA. He has served in many Rotary positions including as a director and vice president of Rotary International and as a trustee and vice chair of the Rotary Foundation.

Other volunteer service include terms as president of the Maine Municipal Association and of the Maine Town and City Association, chair of ecomaine which is the state's largest recycler, chair of the Rotary Action Group for Family Health and AIDS Prevention, global chair of the Rotary Leadership Institute and he served as a member of the Board of Visitors of the Edmund S. Muskie School of Public Service from which he had earned a Master's in Public Policy and Management prior to it being named as the Muskie School.

He served his entire professional career with the Town of Cape Elizabeth, Maine USA beginning as an intern in 1977 and serving as the chief appointed officer (town manager) for 31 years until his retirement in 2016.



PDG Gurjeet Singh Sekhon is a distinguished Rotarian who has been elected as Rotary International Director for 2027-29 for RI Zone 4 & 7. He is a director at Rg Info Soft Private Limited, an IT company based in Amritsar, Punjab, India, which he co-founded in 2000. PDG Sekhon has held various leadership positions within Rotary International, including Past District Governor (PDG) of District 3070. ### Facts of Science
