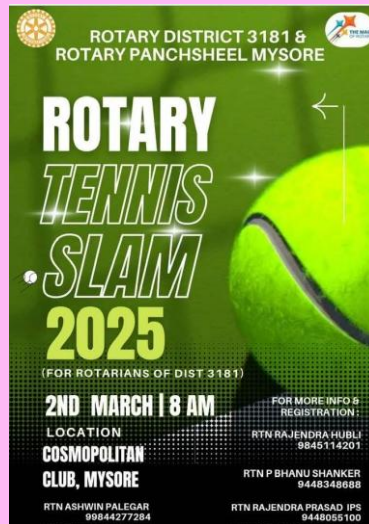

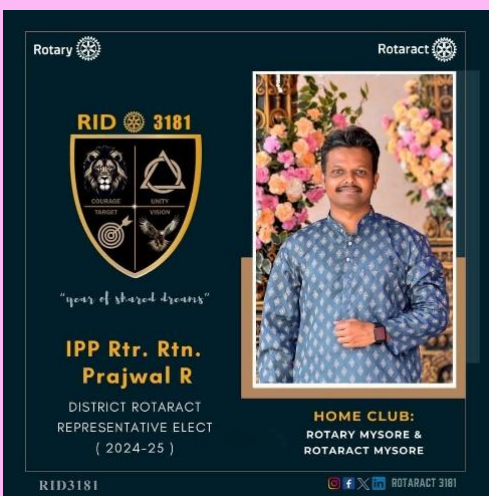

RI ASSEMBLY @ Orlando Florida USA a day for RI President Elect



Rotary International President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo asked members to Unite for Good by embracing growth, service, and connection as he outlined a plan to expand "the best-qualified team of volunteers on the planet."

"Rotary's greatest asset is not our history, our projects, or even our unmatched global reach. It is our members," de Camargo said at the organization's International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on 10 February. He noted praise from one of Rotary's partners about "the extraordinary dedication" of Rotary members. "That recognition from an outsider deepened my understanding: Rotary's greatest gift to the world is its people."

De Camargo, a member of the Rotary Club of Santo André, São Paulo, Brazil, emphasized the importance of seeking out new perspectives and strengthening Rotary's service to communities around the globe. He outlined three "essential pillars" for growth: innovation, continuity, and partnership.

Noting how quickly the world changes, de Camargo urged members to innovate.

"Technology, social expectations, and economic conditions evolve constantly, and Rotary must evolve with them," he said. "Innovation is how we adapt to this changing world." One important way to do this, de Camargo said, is by embracing and promoting a variety of club models. Satellite clubs, cause-based clubs, enterprise clubs, and passport clubs offer people different ways to experience Rotary. Noting that his wife helped charter a satellite club with nearly 50 members, he said, "Future Rotary members are out there. We must meet them where they are."

De Camargo also emphasized the importance of leadership continuity and said he observed its benefits during his extensive travels in the past 18 months. Districts thrive, he said, when governors build on their predecessors' efforts, ensuring that programs and strategies continue without interruption.

He cited an effort to build wells in Nigeria, an initiative in Pakistan that helped people affected by devastating floods to find a better future, and a Rotary grant-funded program in India where children get lifesaving care. "Continuity is not about uniformity; it's about alignment," de Camargo said. "When district leaders work together, envisioning Rotary beyond their 'governor year,' they set the stage for long-term success." Rotary members working alone can achieve great things, de Camargo said, but collaborating with others makes it possible to change the world. He noted that Rotary's historic effort against polio has been undertaken with partners such as the Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization, and UNICEF. Without these partners, de Camargo said, Rotary couldn't have had the same impact. He suggested exploring other kinds of partnerships to attract members and revitalize clubs.

Partnering with business associations, professional organizations, and academic institutions can help Rotary attract members while embracing diversity in professions and perspectives, he said. "By reaching out to professionals who share our values of service and engagement, we can expand Rotary's capacity to do good in the world." Ultimately, de Camargo said, all of Rotary's achievements and growth depend on members. By focusing on attracting and retaining them, Rotary can renew its strength as well as its ability to create change in communities for years to come.

"In a world often divided, Rotary stands as a beacon of unity and hope," de Camargo said. "Our projects bring together people of all races, religions, genders, ideologies, and economic backgrounds, uniting us in a shared purpose: to do good in the world. ... Let's build a Rotary that unites for good and ensures a brighter future for all."

2025 PRESIDENTIAL PEACE CONFERENCE ISTANBUL TÜRKİYE



Building peace requires thoughtful, sustained efforts and meaningful partnerships, Rotary International President Stephanie A. Urchick told attendees at a peace conference in Istanbul. The presidential conference, held 20-22 February, focused on "Healing in a Divided World."

In her opening address, Urchick described the dedication required for true healing to take place. "Our time together here is a testament to our shared belief in the power of peacebuilding," she said. "But let's acknowledge something essential: The act of 'Healing in a Divided World' is not



something we can achieve quickly or easily. It takes an intentional commitment over time." Participants from various backgrounds outlined how that commitment could take shape.

At a session focused on technology and media, speakers discussed how technology can reinforce both peace and conflict. They highlighted the impact of artificial intelligence, the ways technology can bolster peacebuilding efforts, and the expansive threat of misinformation.

Sheldon Himelfarb, an award-winning filmmaker and the founder of PeaceTech Lab, called for peacebuilders to forge a global response to misinformation. The danger it poses, he argued, is comparable to that of war, pandemics, and climate change.



"Misinformation [is] a problem so serious, and so far-reaching, that I believe it is rapidly becoming (if it's not there already) an existential threat to the planet," he said. "Fortunately, each day there are more and more people working on this new existential threat, developing tools for fact checking, content labeling, media literacy, AI for peacebuilding, and more."



Healing the environment and humanity

Other sessions focused on environmental issues in peacebuilding. Nada El Agizy, president of the Rotary E-Club of Egy-International and director of sustainable development and international cooperation at the League of Arab States, emphasized a particular threat in the Middle East.

"Climate change poses one of the most significant challenges the Arab States region has ever faced," she said. "The region is considered one of the world's foremost climate-change hotspots, and it is highly vulnerable to the negative impacts of global warming."



ROTARY “Champions Of Peace”

Six Rotary members and participants from around the world have been recognized as Rotary People of Action: 'Champions of Peace' for their contributions to peacebuilding, conflict resolution, and sustainable community development.

Around the world, Rotary members engage with communities, collaborate with experts, and build partnerships to address the underlying causes of conflict. Through service projects, humanitarian aid, academic training, and youth exchanges, Rotary helps to create healthier and more peaceful societies where people can thrive. “Peacebuilding starts with individuals who take the first step toward resolving conflict, building trust, and fostering understanding,” said Stephanie Urchick, Rotary International President. “By leading efforts in their communities, these honorees exemplify how grassroots efforts can lay the foundation for lasting peace.” For over a century, Rotary has committed itself to addressing the needs of communities across the globe. To recognize these efforts, Rotary honors six initiatives annually through the People of Action Honors program. This year's 'Champions of Peace' include:



Anne Kjaer Bathel (Germany) - A Rotary Peace Fellow alumna and founder of ReDI Digital Kids, Anne leads a project that provides psycho-social support and digital education to refugee children in Germany, helping them regain stability, confidence, and future opportunities. Since its inception, the program has reached over 4,000 children, fostering social inclusion and empowerment.

Sanela Music (Bosnia-Herzegovina) - A Rotary Representative to the United Nations in Geneva, Sanela spearheads the Harmony Project: Mental Health Matters, which addresses transgenerational trauma and fosters interethnic reconciliation in post-war Bosnia-Herzegovina. Her work has empowered students and educators to build emotional resilience and combat stigma around mental health.



Swati Herkal (India) - A Rotary leader and philanthropist, Swati pioneered a regenerative agriculture initiative that supports small farmers in India. By introducing sustainable farming techniques, her project has increased crop yields, reduced financial strain on farmers, and revitalized rural economies—helping to prevent migration and social unrest.

Linda Low (USA) - A Rotary Peace Fellow and founder of the Global Partners in Peace Rotary Club, Linda created Leadership Dialogues, a program designed to bridge societal divisions through structured, values-based discussions. The initiative has engaged over 2,000 people worldwide, promoting deeper understanding and conflict resolution.

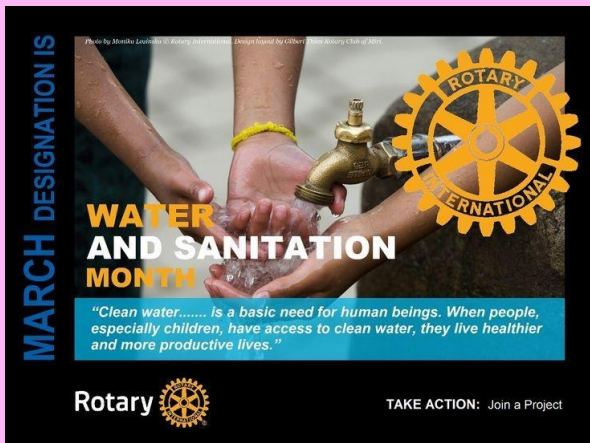


María Cristina Cifuentes (Colombia) - A Rotary Peace Fellow and climate advocate, María played a vital role in integrating peace-focused strategies into Colombia's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Climate Agreement. Her work ensures that vulnerable communities affected by armed conflict are included in national climate resilience strategies.

Domino Sulieman Frank (Chad) - A Rotary Peace Fellow with over 20 years of experience in peacebuilding, Domino leads the Corridors of Peace project, which provides vocational training for displaced women and girls in Chad. His initiative equips participants with marketable skills, fostering economic independence and stability in conflict-prone regions.

MARCH – WATER AND SANITATION MONTH

How Rotary makes it happen

Through water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) programs, Rotary's people of action mobilise resources, form partnerships and invest in infrastructure and training the yields long-term change.

The Rotary Foundation is changing the world by providing grants for projects and activities around the globe and in our own backyard.

Rotary-USAID Partnership: Rotary has partnered with the United States Agency for International Development in Ghana, Madagascar and Uganda to implement sustainable, long-term programs to improve water supplies, sanitation and hygiene.

WASH in Schools Target Challenge: Rotary has challenged its members to develop sustainable water, sanitation and hygiene education projects in five countries: Belize, Guatemala, Honduras, India and Kenya.

WASH projects: Since 2013, The Rotary Foundation has invested in more than 1,000 WASH projects in more than 100 countries. Through grants from The Rotary Foundation and fundraising by Rotary clubs, our volunteers have supported water purification, hygiene, education, latrine construction and waste management. During March, Rotary Water and Sanitation Month, Rotary is celebrating its commitment to create healthier communities by supplying clean water and sanitation facilities to prevent the spread of infectious diseases. All of this fits extremely well with two of our projects which were instigated over the past six months.

Firstly, our support by way of a \$2,500 donation following the strong magnitude 6.5 earthquake struck Seram Island in Maluku, Indonesia, near the provincial capital of Ambon which resulted in the purchase of around 100 water treatments systems which were not only invaluable at the time but will be a much needed asset will into the future.

Secondly, our involvement with the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central creating school toilet and sanitation blocks in schools in Nasik India which will be finalised this year.
