The origin of the four-way test

Transcript:

In 1932, the American Rotarian Herbert J. TAYLOR, newly appointed head of a kitchen utensil company on the verge of ruin (Club Aluminium Products Company), refused to file for bankruptcy contrary to the advice given by the creditor committee and felt that his employees needed an ethical reference. He then wrote four questions on a small piece of white paper:

- Is it the **TRUTH**?
- Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
- Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
- Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?



He turned round and saved the company in great financial difficulty by making it adopt this simple course of action. He called it "The Four-Way test" of the things we think, say or do.

In 1940 he gave Rotary International permission to use the Four-Way Test, which officially became the symbol of Rotary ethics in 1943.

The Rotary International Anthem

Transcript:

The anthem chosen by the Board of Directors in February 2000 is an arrangement of the march of the Egmont Overture by Ludwig van Beethoven (Op. 84).

This anthem is intended to be played on various occasions, especially at the beginning of official meetings: district assemblies, district conferences, all international meetings, to accompany the flag ceremony, and often at statutory meetings.

It gives them a solemn atmosphere.

There are 2 versions: a short one of 45 seconds and a long of 2 minutes, one or the other adapting perfectly to different circumstances.

As with the other anthems, the audience rises when it is played.

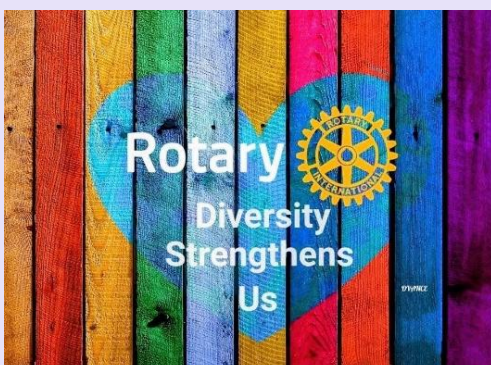
The national anthems of the personalities present at these various meetings can also be included with the Rotary International anthem.

Rashmi had Chat Concierge, a multi-agent chat experience for auto dealerships that handles intent disambiguation, tool invocation, and human handoffs to deliver safer, more personalized customer journeys. The TWIML AI Podcast discussed Capital One's platform-centric approach to AI agents and how it separates design from runtime governance, embedding policies, guardrails, and cyber controls across agent threat boundaries. Rashmi shared how the team approaches the developer experience for agent builders, observability, and evals for stochastic, multi-agent workflows; and strategies for model specialization, including fine-tuning and distillation. They also covered standards and abstraction, closed-loop learning from production telemetry, and key lessons for enterprises building agentic systems.

With over 20 years of experience, Rashmi specializes in building and delivering predictive and analytical enterprise products across diverse industries such as oil and gas, high tech, manufacturing, automotive, retail, IM&C, chemical.

Rashmi's expertise extends to spearheading customer projects focused on IoT and AI-based predictive maintenance solutions as co-innovation pilots.

She is now Senior Director, Enterprise Generative AI Platform at Capital One at San Francisco USA.

PolioPlus Precursors



Transcript:

We all know that it was in 1985 that Rotary International launched the PolioPlus program.

However, many years earlier, Rotary-Clubs had taken initiatives to fight against this terrible disease.

Thus, in 1915, the Rotary-Club of Toledo, Ohio, USA, was the first to invest in this field.

In 1937, Porter LORING, member of the Rotary-club of San Antonio, Texas, USA, had offered an iron lung worth \$2,400 and had been named "Friend of Humanity".

In 1945, members of the Rotary Club of Deming, New Mexico, USA, donated an \$1,800 iron lung to the local hospital.

Then, in 1950, the Rotarians of Stoneham, Massachusetts, USA, offered a portable steel lung.

These few actions identified are probably not the only ones and testify to the fact that Rotary International's efforts to fight polio began more than a century.
