What is Rotary

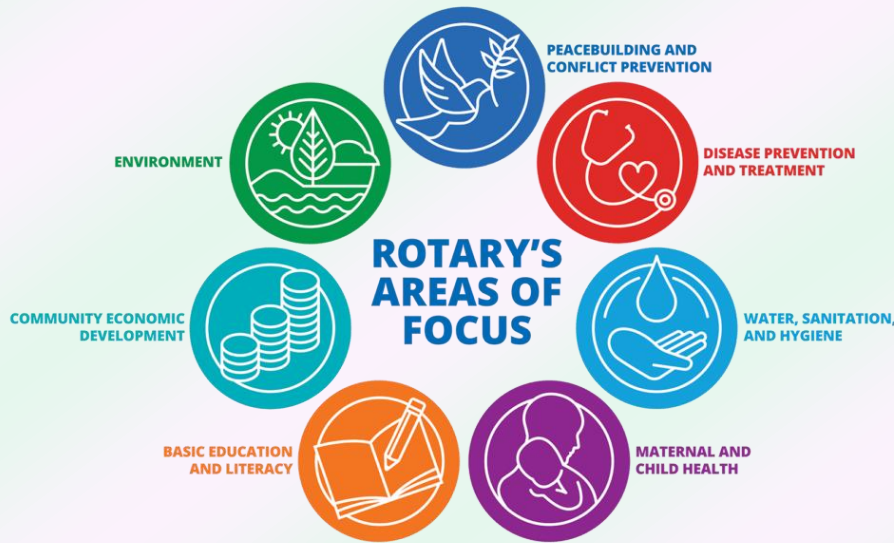

Rotary International focuses its efforts on seven key areas to make a global impact: Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention, Disease Prevention and Treatment, Water and Sanitation, Maternal and Child Health, Basic Education and Literacy, Economic and Community Development, and Protecting the Environment. These areas represent the most effective and sustainable service projects undertaken by Rotary clubs worldwide.

Here's a more detailed look at each area:

Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention:

Rotary promotes understanding and peace through conversations, training, and conflict resolution initiatives.

Disease Prevention and Treatment:

Rotary combats diseases like polio, HIV/AIDS, and malaria through education, prevention, and treatment programs.

Water and Sanitation:

Rotary focuses on providing access to clean water, sanitation facilities, and hygiene education to communities in need.

Maternal and Child Health:

Rotary works to improve maternal and child health outcomes by supporting access to quality healthcare and resources.

Basic Education and Literacy:

Rotary invests in education by promoting literacy, supporting schools, and providing resources for teachers and students.

Economic and Community Development:

Rotary empowers communities by supporting local businesses, creating job opportunities, and promoting sustainable economic growth.

Protecting the Environment:

Rotary is increasingly focused on environmental sustainability, addressing issues like climate change, water conservation, and pollution.

Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.

A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies. He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.

Lunsford joined the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza in 1991 and has since served as district governor (2001-02), RI director (2013-15), and trustee of The Rotary Foundation (2021-25, vice chair 2024-25). He has been a member of RI committees, including the Executive Committee (chair 2014-15), Membership Growth Committee (chair 2016-18), and Nominating Committee for President of RI (chair 2023-24). He also has served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (chair 2023-24), Finance Committee (chair 2022-23 and 2024-25), and Participant Experience Committee (chair 2023-24).

Lunsford has been awarded The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award, The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service, and the RI Service Above Self Award. He and his wife, Jill Lunsford, have two children and one grandchild. They are Major Donors, Bequest Society members, multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and Sustaining Members.

Update from RI President.....



Dear Rotary Leaders,

As you may recall, last April, President-elect SangKoo Yun informed us all of his diagnosis of pancreatic cancer and his decision to step back from Rotary responsibilities so he could focus on his treatment.

Today, President-elect SangKoo notified me in a letter that he has decided to resign as President-elect of Rotary International after extensive consultation with his doctors. In his message, he shared the following sentiments:

"My doctors have advised that it may not be possible for me to meet the demanding travel and schedule required of our President. As much as I wish to serve in this role, I must honor that advice. It has been a tremendous honor and pleasure to be given the opportunity to lead our organization. I will continue to serve however I can, and my love for Rotary and my commitment to our mission remains unshaken."

On behalf of the Rotary International Board, and with a heavy heart, I accepted SangKoo's resignation. While it is a difficult decision, we deeply appreciate SangKoo's thoughtful consideration and his focus on the best interest of Rotary. The Board will convene soon to determine next steps. We will keep you updated on any further developments.

I want to thank SangKoo for his tremendous service, leadership, and contributions to our organization. Please join me in wishing him a swift recovery and good health in the future.

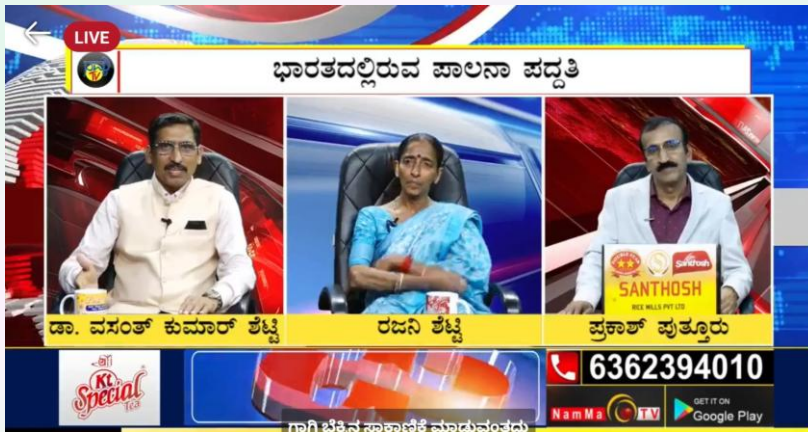

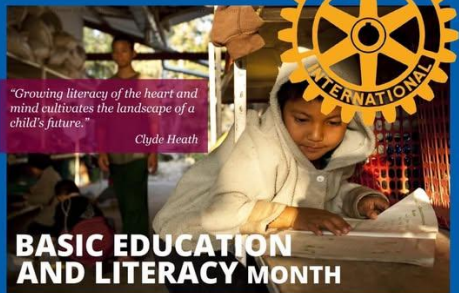

The Basic Education & Literacy Rotary Action Group (BELRAG) is a network of Rotarians dedicated to alleviating illiteracy, improving literacy teaching and learning, and increasing awareness of the importance of literacy.
