



Members of these groups share an interest, wish to further their vocational development, or want to make new friends, explore opportunities for service, and enhance their experience in Rotary. Fellowships must have active members in at least five countries and may include Rotarians, Rotarians' family members, Rotaractors, alumni, and program participants.

# The Arch Klumph Society

Named after the sixth president of Rotary, the Arch Klumph Society recognizes The Rotary Foundation's highest tier of donors — those who have contributed \$250,000 or more during their lifetime. Membership

Membership in the Arch Klumph Society is lifelong. Each member has the opportunity to have his or her portrait placed in the Arch Klumph Society Gallery, located on the 17th floor of Rotary International World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA. Portraits are etched on glass plaques to create a stunning display of our Foundation's most valued supporters. Members will also have their profiles included in an interactive display, plus receive pins, pendants, and several other benefits commensurate with their generosity.

#### Induction and elevation ceremonies

Society members can choose to be inducted in one of several ways:

- At a multi-day ceremony with other inductees at Rotary International World Headquarters
- At a ceremony with local Rotary leaders during a Rotary institute
- At a ceremony during the Rotary International Convention

Other induction options may be made available each year at the discretion of the trustee chair.

The Rotary Foundation now also offers elevation ceremonies to honor those who have achieved a higher recognition level within the Arch Klumph Society. These ceremonies take place in conjunction with other Arch Klumph Society inductions and provide another opportunity to celebrate these special donors' continued generosity.

#### Arch C. Klumph: The Father of The Rotary Foundation

For a man best known as the father of The Rotary Foundation, Arch C. Klumph was modest about his role in its creation.



In 1928, he listed three accomplishments that gave him "more satisfaction than any other contributions to Rotary" — and launching the Foundation wasn't among them. Instead, he emphasized his role in writing Rotary's Constitution in 1915,

which he asserted "gave Rotary International its first centralized power and made all the Objects and fundamentals of Rotary universal." He also took pride in establishing attendance reports and in being the first to insist on founding a European branch office of Rotary International.

Klumph was born in the small town of Conneautville, Pennsylvania, USA, on 6 June 1869. When he was a child, his family moved to Cleveland, Ohio, where he would become a founding member of the Rotary Club of Cleveland in 1911. As club president in 1913, he advocated for the club to build a reserve that would ensure its means to do future good work. This idea would stay with him as he moved on to serve Rotary in other roles.



Klumph on the cover of the September 1916 issue of The Rotarian. In his message, he reminds members that "Rotary is bigger than any one man, than any board of directors."

Five years after he became a Rotarian, Klumph was elected to serve as Rotary's president for 1916-17. Near the end of his term, at the 1917 Rotary Convention in Atlanta, Georgia, USA, he reminded Rotarians that "Rotary is at the present time entering a new era, demanding improved methods in administrative machinery, with which to carry out the splendid principles which have been laid down heretofore." He defined six points of action, including the establishment of an endowment, which would later become The Rotary Foundation:

"Carrying on, as we are, a miscellaneous community service, it seems eminently proper that we should accept endowments for the purpose of doing good in the world, in charitable, educational or other avenues of community progress, or such funds could be well used for extension work."

Through Klumph's simple yet profound statement, the Rotary Endowment Fund was born. In 1928, the name formally changed to The Rotary Foundation, and a Board of Trustees was established, with Klumph serving as the first trustee chair from 1928 to 1935. Even after stepping down as chair, he remained dedicated to educating Rotary leaders and members about the importance of the Foundation and encouraging contributions.

Klumph died on 3 June 1951 at age 82, but his influence lives on through The Foundation.

From dialysis centres in India to environmental projects in Taiwan and educational initiatives worldwide, we have had a front-row seat to the life-changing results of your generosity. ## A MOMENT IN TIME: ROTARY MAGAZINE'S 2025 PHOTO AWARDS

Sparks fly as Rotary members focus their cameras and freeze-frame the wonders of the world It is one of photography's most memorable images. In Paris, behind the Gare Saint-Lazare, a man leaps across a large puddle. He'll never make it all the way across, but in that split second before splashdown, he hangs in midair, his scissored legs reflected in the water beneath him. The man who captured the image called that split second the "decisive moment." Except that he didn't.

In 1952, the French photographer Henri Cartier-Bresson published a collection of his work under the title Images à la Sauvette: images on the run. His U.S. publisher didn't like that title; instead, it turned to the epigraph, from the 17th-century memoirist Cardinal de Retz, that preceded the book's introductory essay: Il n'y a rien en ce monde qui n'ait un moment décisif. There is nothing in this world that does not have a decisive moment.

Cartier-Bresson didn't care for the English title The Decisive Moment, especially after the phrase came to define him. Yet it did accurately reflect what he'd said elsewhere — "photography can fix eternity in a moment" — and it has become a touchstone for generations of photographers.

That might include the Rotarians featured this year in the magazine's annual Photo Awards. A waterspout swirls above a red-roofed Adriatic town; a shower of sparks explodes over a Midwestern festival; a white-tusked warthog makes its own leap across a water-filled trench in Botswana. Each of them un moment décisif.

Cartier-Bresson also asked, "What is more fleeting than the expression on a human face?" For the answer, see this year's winning People of Action photo: two Rotarians fixed in sublime rapport — life preserved in the act of living, as the French photographer so decisively described such moments.
