RI President's Message for October 2024

With World Polio Day on Oct 24, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now. I had the honour of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for PolioPlus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all

the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This world-class roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralysed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy. These are just a few examples of the many ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year. The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organisation.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

As people of action, we don't have the luxury of giving in to despair, even in the face of tragedy. The best way to honour Aidan's memory is by teaming up and reaching our goal to End Polio Now.

We made a promise to the children of the world and their families. It is incumbent upon us, together with our global partners, to end this threat once and for all.

There are so many ways we can team up to eradicate polio. You can donate to the End Polio Now campaign, join or initiate a PolioPlus Society in your club or district, or take inspiration from the fundraisers I mentioned above.

I encourage Rotary members around the world to continue to seek out new teammates, so that together, we end polio.

Brief Report of the meeting held on 01st October - Advocate Prithviraj spoke about the three new criminal laws passed by the Parliament in July 2024. They are Bharatiya Neeti Samhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarika Suraksha Samhita (BNSS), and Bharatiya Sakshys Adhi Niyam (BSA). These laws replace Indian Penal Code (IPC), the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) and Indian Evidence Act. He said that these new laws shift the criminal justice from punitive to justice oriented. Under Bharatiya Neeti Samhita list offences and punishments are provided. Further an additional provision has been made wherein instead of jail punishment, free community service punishment has been added. Under this clause the guilty is ordered to render free services for the community for a certain period of time in lieu of jail term. He further said that there were earlier 511 sections which have been reduced to 358 now. He also said that these laws are applicable only for all the offences committed on or after 01.07.2024. For offence prior to that date offences committed prior to that date old laws are applicable. He said that now attempting suicide is not an offence. But if you threaten to commit suicide to compel a Government officer to do some work then it is an offence. More stringent laws have been incorporated in respect of offences against women. Death due to rash & negligent driving now attracts punishment of 5 years. However in respect of doctors found negligent in their work the maximum sentence is restricted to 2 years only. In respect of accidents if the driver flees from the spot then gets 10 years punishment as per new law. Murder was earlier section 302 now 103. Mob lynching is also made very strict and may get life imprisonment for all the persons in the mob. The law regarding sedition slightly changed. Earlier anything said against Government was sedition. Now if you say anything against the unity, sovereignty and integrity of our country they come under the sedition law. If police officers are obstructed while controlling riots it is an offence now. Throwing stones against public property or any other type of mischief is offence under Section 353 now.

Sakshya Adhiniyam has leveraged technology in the field of evidence by admitting electronic and digital evidence. High level of scientific investigation is possible now and admitted as evidence under new law. He said that great hard work has gone into making these new laws and it should be appreciated.

President Rtn. Mohan Nair informed that the visit of our District Governor Vikram Datta will be on 22nd October and he briefly outlined his program for the day including luncheon Club Assembly in the afternoon. Further he said the cultural competition scheduled to be held on 6th October has been postponed. There is going to be end polio car rally in October in Mangalore by all the clubs. Free yoga camp will be inaugurated by the Dist. Governor on 13th October morning at 5.30 am. Inter District Beach Sports will be held on 1st December along with clubs from nearby Districts. He also informed about the on line meeting about Reducing the burden of Dementia by Rotary Interventions on 13th October 7 pm.

In the beginning Rtn. Pundalika Shenoy rendered the invocation and in the end Rtn. J. V. Shetty proposed the vote of thanks.


