

Finance Minister Mrs. Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Central Government Budget for 2025-26 in the Parliament on 1st Feb 2025. Summary of Key Announcements from Budget are: The Budget 2025 focuses on Gareeb (poor), Yuva (youth), and Nari (women).

## **Agriculture & Rural Development:**

- Addressing underemployment in agriculture, benefiting 1.7 crore farmers.
- Launching a National Mission on high-yielding seeds.
- 5-year program to increase cotton productivity.
- Kisan Credit Cards for 7.7 crore farmers, with loan limit enhanced to ?5 lakh.
- Second Gene Bank to be set up for future food security.

## **Infrastructure & Connectivity:**

- India Post to become a large public logistics organization.
- Modified UDAN scheme to be launched, connecting 120 new destinations.
- Greenfield airports to be facilitated in Bihar.
- Top 50 tourism destinations to be developed.
- National Geospatial Mission announced.

#### **Healthcare & Education:**

- 50,000 Atal Tinkering Labs to be set up in government schools over 5 years.
- 10,000 additional seats in medical institutes, creating 75,000 seats in 5 years.

#### **MSME & Industry:**

- Term loans up to ?20 crore for MSMEs.
- SWAMIH Fund to complete another 40,000 housing units in 2025.
- 9 handicraft items added to duty-free inputs.
- Extending incorporation benefits for startups for five years.

#### **Taxation & Finance:**

- New income tax bill next week.
- Jan Vishwas Bill 2.0 to decriminalize 100 provisions.
- Revised fiscal deficit estimated at 4.8% of GDP.
- Capital expenditure at ?10.18 lakh crore.
- Gross market borrowings at ?14.82 lakh crore.
- Social welfare surcharge on 82 tariff lines waived.
- 36 life-saving drugs fully exempted from customs duty.
- Personal tax reforms focused on the middle class.
- TCS for remittance on education purposes removed.
- Reduced compliance burden for small charitable trusts.
- New scheme to determine Arms Length Price in international transactions.
- Digitalization being operationalized in tax frameworks.
- No income tax payable up to ?12 lakh income.
- Capital gains limit extended to ?12.7 lakh.
- Income tax slabs changed.
- Rs. 70,000 tax benefit for income of Rs. 18 lakh.
- Maximum tax rate of 30% kicks in at Rs. 24 lakh taxable income (Compared to Rs. 15 lakh earlier).



Brave Hearts Awards were given to the Indian Defence Forces Vetarans by Colonel N. S. Bhandary (Retd) Indian Army in the weekly meeting held on 28th January 2025. Mr. Tony Pinto Petty Officer (Retd. Indian Navy), Sgt. Shivaram Bhat K ( Retd. Indian Air Force), Subedar Appu Shetty B. K. ( Retd. Indian Army) were honoured. Conferring the award Colonel Bhandary informed that as we are celebrating the 76th Republic day he woud like to talk about some aspects of Indian constitution. Our Constitution has provided for 6 fundamental rights. However during the Emergency time in 1976 an amendment to constitution 31(c) was done to suspend all fundamental rights during the emergency times. Further 42nd amendment was done so that no law brought by the central government can not be questioned. Section 354(4), 355(5) were removed. But the Supreme court struck down these amendments. The members of the drafting committee of the constitution went to 60 countries in the world to study and then wrote the constitution. Though India became Independent in 1947, India only became a Dominic state. The Viceroy who was the Head of the country prior to independence was replaced by the Governor General. That means India still owed allegiance to King George of England. Only after India became Republic in 1950 and President of India assumed office India really became a free country. Even now Canada Australia etc. don't have Presidents and continue as a Dominic Countries.. Maximum points of our fundamental rights were taken from the USA, England and German constitutions. Nobody is able to change the Constitution but Amendment can be brought. This is known as the Concept of Basic Strucure Doctrine. Altogether 107 amendments have been done in the last 75 years. Last amendment was in 2021 about Women's Reservation Bill. Earlier there were 395 articles. Now 470 articles are there. Original Constitution was written in pen by Calliographer late Prem Bihari. Total 251 pages. Famous artist Nandalal Bose has drawn pictures from Ramamayana, Mahabharata etc. The original copy is preserved in Parilament House at 20°C & 30° Relative humidity under Helium Nitrogen gas. Under article 51A every citizen has Fundamental resposibilities. He said after one attains the age of 60 one should have Economic Security, Health Security and Emotional Security.

Rtn. Mohan Nair presided and welcomed. He informed that the just concluded Rotary conference at Adyar Gardens was very good well organised and was a spectacular success. The speakers, entertainment programmes, food and arrangements etc. were excellent. Our club got the TRF Challenge 5000+ award for contribution of more than 5000 dollars to TRF.
