Brief Report of the meeting held on 27.05.2025 - Dr. Palakshappa, Professor and HOD Civil Engineering Dept. PA College of Engineering talked about thirsty planet. He said that one of the most significant environmental change taking place in earth presently is global warming. The atmospheric temperature is slowly increasing everywhere and this will seriously affect the future ot man kind. The whole world is fighting to stop increase in the temperature of Earth. The main reason for global warming is release of greenhouse gases like Carbon dioxide, Methane etc. By increasing the percentage of forest cover in the earth carbon di oxide level could be reduced. In the 2015 Paris Agreement on Climate Change the whole world has agreed to reduce the carbon emission levels. They have fixed that maximum increase in world temparature should be allowed to increase by only 1.5 ° centigrade. Already there is an increase of 0.5° centigrade. Therefore every country should reduce the carbon emissions. India has agreed to make carbon emission level to zero by 2050. Some of the European countries have already reached zero carbon emission levels.

Presently world population is 8 billion people which is expected to go up to 10 billion people by 2050. Therefore the requirement of water will increase where as the availability of water is decreasing by global warming. Further water is getting polluted by industrialisation. Therefore it is necessary to ensure that clean drinking water is made available to everybody. Otherwise people cannot live by shortage of water or by increase in temperature. Water gets reduced by evaporation due to the higher temperature. The total life span of Earth is estimated at 700 billoin years of which 300 billion years have already completed. Therefore people have to live in earth for next 400 billion years. And we should make it usable by human beings for all these 400 billion years. Hence we have to ensure that we don't exhaust water now itself.

One of the alternative methods of reducing the global warming is by not using the fossil fuels like Petrol, Diesel etc. which increase the emission of carbon dioxide and

increase the global warming. Therefore we have to go for natural renewable energy sources such as solar energy, wind energy, tidal energy, geo thermal energy etc. We have to increase use of electrical vehicles as they do not emit carbon gases and help in reducing global warming. Now it has become compulsory for all engineering students to learn environment engineering.

Another way we may reduce the use of water. For taking bath one bucket of water 20 L is sufficient per person. But people take bath in very big tub taking 500 litres of water. This practice should be stopped. John F. Kennedy said that for the person who solves water problems should be given two Nobel Awards. One for Science and another for Peace.







As population increases demand for water also increase. So we have to go for innovation which will help in preserving the water and reducing carbon emissions leading to a better world we can leave for our future generations.
