Not in a hundred years has mankind experienced such uniquely challenging times. The first and second world wars and Partition of India, were more devastating. But even they did not universally affect all human beings on earth like this pandemic; demolishing both lives and livelihood. And it looks like this situation will persist for another year at least.

Rotarians have risen to every challenge over the last century and more. Over 2000 Rotarians served in the First World War and nearly 50 laid down their lives. In 1918 an influenza strain known as the Spanish flu caused the worst pandemic in centuries. When the war ended the soldiers returned home and brought it with them. Between 50 and 100 million died. Throughout the Great Depression which followed, Rotarians kept their businesses and Rotary afloat, working doubly hard to support the community. During the second world war, both Mussolini and Hitler made it clear they would not tolerate Rotary in their countries. Many Rotarians met clandestinely and continued to serve society, focusing on Peace & Conflict Resolution, helping to end the war and win lasting peace. In recent times, a number of Rotarians risked physical violence and lives in the PAN countries in their attempt to eliminate polio from the face of the planet.

In this context, what does Rotary Mysore do? It would have been easy to shut shop in the lockdown...But that is not the Rotary way. **Rotary Mysore led in every possible service avenue** - donating money and material, feeding the migrants, supplying medicines, medical kits, sanitizers, face masks, gloves, PPE kits to the frontline warriors, some providing their workplace and convention hall for packing and packaging, some emptying their hearts and pharma godowns on a daily basis...From the global grant of \$25,000 towards covid relief, we provided 20 ICU cots to the Mysore covid hospital, furnished the entire ICU, and provided patient monitoring systems to Chamarajanagar, Madikeri and Mangalore covid hospitals.

Every Rotarian (and many non-Rotarians) contributed - some did way beyond the call of Rotary. The work has made an everlasting impact on the covid warriors - doctors, nurses, support staff, police, pourakarmikas, drivers... **Mysore City Corporation has felicitated Rotary Mysore for its outstanding service in the last few months and the Rotary District has recognized our efforts.**

It is only during testing times that one's true colors are visible. On those parameters, Rotary Mysore has come out in flying colors. **25 years from now, when Rotary Mysore celebrates its centenary, this year's efforts would be cherished.**

A UNIQUE CHARTER DAY AND INSTALLATION CEREMONY

This year's was a unique installation in these unique times. Happening at Rotary Mysore, it was physically attended by about 40 Rotarians. Rest of us were virtual attendees. President **Chetan Vishwanath** started the proceedings with his valedictory talk where he thanked everyone for their co-operation. *President Chetan, you and your team have done fantastic service, especially in the last 4 months, amidst great challenges. You have done us proud.*

The new team led by President **Manjesh Kumar** was installed by our **PDG M. Lakshminarayan.** The new team will do well to emulate and surpass the previous team's stupendous efforts. He recalled the many challenges faced by Rotary in the last 100+ years – the world wars, the 1919 pandemic, the Great Depression, polio...Rotary members sometimes even met surreptitiously, and overcame these challenges. He reminded us that Environment is the latest focus area of Rotary, and Rotary has already spent \$18m towards this cause.

PDG Vasudevamurthy, in his *aasheervachana*, called it his privilege to be a member of Rotary Mysore and blessed the new team and wished that they will take the club to greater heights. **PDG R Guru**, in his online talk, said that in his 46 years with the club, this was the first time he was missing the installation event. He was particularly effusive in his praise for Chetan and his team who had done excellent work in these challenging times. He wished Manjesh and team well and was confident that they would shine under trying circumstances. Congratulating the new inductees, he was sure that they would keep the flag of the senior-most club in the district, flying high.

PP SK Sanjay, briefed us about the TRF-supported projects from Rotary Mysore. Last year we did **global grant projects** worth **\$100,000** – the **SGS Hospital diagnostic lab** worth \$50,000 and the **Emergency Training Center** worth another \$50,000. From the \$25,000 grant towards **covid relief**, we provided *20 ICU cots to the Mysore covid hospital, furnished the entire ICU, and provided patient monitoring systems to Chamarajanagar, Madikeri and Mangalore covid hospitals.* District Grants of \$5000 While Rotary Mysore has contributed over \$400,000 to TRF, we have received over \$1,000,000 from the TRF. Last year, we contributed \$60,800 - \$50,000 from **Bastian Joseph** of Lunar Industries, \$2000 from **PDG R Guru** and \$1000 from **PDG Lakshminarayan**, as always. We have 12 major donors and we have **Rtn Dr BR Pai** joining them. New **PHFs** are Rotarians **Praveen**, **Suhas**, **Ponnanna** and **Chetan Vishwanath** (twice). PP Sanjay hoped that we will go beyond last year's numbers this time.

AG **MCS Manohara** too appreciated the remarkable job by Chetan and team and assured Manjesh and team that he is there with them. Love, affection and faith in Rotary has brought him here; he exhorted Rotarians to create opportunities, be a leader and create leaders. He concluded with these words from DVG.
