they have passed on to us. As we look ahead, our collective effort remains to instill these same values in our children, nurturing


a culture of respect, gratitude, and togetherness for generations to come.

Rotary Mysore Midtown Extends Support to Om Sri Gurulinga Jangamadevera Mutt







The Mutt provides free food, shelter, and education to all its resident students. With both State and Central syllabi, in English and Kannada medium, the institution ensures holistic education while sustaining itself through dedicated efforts and benevolent contributions. The Mutt has been doing yeoman service to society, shaping the lives of hundreds of underprivileged children.

Rotarian Manickam's association with the ashram inspired him to extend substantial support towards the welfare of the students. Following a visit in July along with President Rtn. Rakesh and Rtn. Azeez, the team identified some of the institute's pressing needs.

Rtn. Manickam generously donated INR 1,00,000 towards custom-made bunker cots for the hostel, manufactured and supplied by Rtn. Jaykumar.

Rtn. Veeresh contributed groceries worth INR 25,000, easing the daily operations of the school kitchen that serves more than 600 meals a day.

Responding to the request for improved dining hall facilities, Rotary Mysore Midtown sponsored 5 high-powered fans worth INR 40,000, ensuring a more comfortable experience for the children during mealtimes.

A total of 18 Rotarians participated in the visit, personally handing over the contributions in a heartwarming program that brought smiles to the young wards of the mutt. The head pontiff expressed his deep appreciation for the Rotary's efforts, with special mention of Rtn. Manickam's magnanimity. Touched by the service rendered by the institute, Rtn. Rangaraj pledged to bear the education expenses of one student for a year.

The visit concluded with a guided tour of the premises, followed by a scrumptious prasadam lunch hosted by the ashram. In a touching gesture, the Swamiji felicitated all visiting Rotarians, acknowledging Rotary Midtown's continued commitment to service.

This initiative stands as yet another testimony to Rotary Mysore Midtown's 45-year legacy of impactful community service, driven by the motto of "Service Above Self."

Manickam personally led the group on a guided tour, offering detailed insights into the operations of the breeder facility, which is currently in an exciting phase of expansion. The visit to the cold storage facility stood out as a memorable learning experience, giving members a deeper appreciation of the scale and sophistication of the enterprise. True to his warm hospitality, Rtn. Manickam ensured every guest was well cared for—refreshing tender coconuts and piping hot omelettes were served, making the day both informative and enjoyable. The Rotarians also received a unique takeaway—special double-yolk eggs from the farm, a delightful surprise that added to the experience. The visit was a fine blend of learning, fellowship, and camaraderie. Members left with not only a greater understanding of the breeder farm operations but also gratitude for the host's generosity.
