Rotarians generously contributed towards a project of providing financial support to set up a solar panel for providing power connection to have two lights and to the land line phone at the auto stand located on DC Office Road, Manipal. The project cost is Rs. 17,500/-. This project was proposed in the memory of Late Rtn. Air Commander V V Nair. The project was being directed by Community Service Director Rtn. Rajavarma Ariga



1980: The RI Board of Directors and Rotary clubs in India, Sweden, Switzerland, and the United States propose an enactment to remove women from the RI and club constitutions and bylaws all references to members as "male persons." In a lawsuit filed by the Duarte club, the California Superior Court in 1983 rules in favor of Rotary International, upholding gender-based qualification for membership in California Rotary clubs. In 1986, the California Court of Appeals reverses the lower court's decision, preventing the enforcement of the provision in California. The California Supreme Court refuses to hear the case, and it is appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court.
