On 19th October, we have a district event, RYLA at Rajangana Udupi hosted by RC Udupi. It is programme which is focussed on leadership. Each year, thousands of young people take part in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program worldwide. Young people are chosen for their leadership potential to attend an allexpenses-paid camp to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice. Rotary Clubs & Districts select participants and facilitate the events curriculum. RYLA aims to:

- > Provide an effective training experience for selected youth & potential leaders.
- Encourage leadership of youth by youth.
- Encourage youth to make a difference in their communities through volunteer work & social responsibility.
- Demonstrate Rotary's respect & concern for youth.

RYLA was officially adopted by RI in 1971 & is one of the most significant & fastest growing programs of Rotary Service. RYLA programs often lead to the formation or strengthening of Rotract or Interact Clubs.

PDG Rtn. Dr. Jayagowri introduced the guest speaker of the day, Col. Anand Shirali with great pride. After clearing the SSB selection process, he got commissioned into the 20th Battalion, the Rajputana Rifles, an elite regiment of the Indian Army in 2007 as a Lieutenant. Col. Anand has served on all the borders of the country in Arunachal, Rajasthan, Punjab, Himachal and Kashmir. He has risen to being a colonel at a very young age.

Secretary Rtn. Farida Uppin read out the message from his School Treacher, IPP Rtn. Deepa Bhandary, RC Udupi. The message stated that Anand was a dedicated student who was passionate about whatever he took up. He had leadership quality in childhood and used to take up herculean task proactively.

Col. Anand Shirali spoke on "Leadership in Army". He said that the Commanding Officer in an Army is like a father to his Battalion. He plays all three roles - Executive, Legislature & Judiciary to his team. Army Chief leads the team by example. He teaches, empowers, invests time, effort & patience to his team members. He is the motivational factor for the team. He takes care of the generic welfare of the soldiers and also takes care of their family issues & concerns. Anand cited some anecdotes on how an Army grooms the team & in return how the team members adore the Army Chief & abides by his order to the extent of sacrificing life. Col. Shirali further explained how a leader can set bad example by making false statements, which are impractical and taking irrational decisions. Army Commander needs to use strategy and plan meticulously. Anand concluded the session with a significant note to the gathering to encourage the next generation to join defence and be a part of nation building.
