
Looking Forward






Organic Farming







The Rotary Four-Way Test is a 24-word ethical guide used by Rotarians to assess the morality of their thoughts, words, and actions.

Meaning and Purpose:

TRUTH:

The first question emphasizes the importance of honesty and accuracy in all dealings.

FAIRNESS:

The second question highlights the need for equitable treatment and consideration of all parties involved.

GOODWILL AND FRIENDSHIPS:

This question encourages actions that foster positive relationships and mutual respect.

BENEFICIAL:

The final question emphasizes the importance of ensuring that actions are advantageous to everyone concerned, promoting a win-win outcome.

Your Directions:


In a large bowl, combine chickpeas, cucumber, tomatoes, onion, carrot, and bell peppers.
