The first batch of beneficiaries, the trainers & many villagers attended the function. This project is unique as this is a part of the Women empowerment programme. There will be 3 batches for training daily, totalling 28 beneficiaries being trained with 9 machines. The beautifully built new institute is about 1050 sq ft.



The E-Shala Project which was the brainchild of Past President Rtn Velu Pethi and sponsored by Pethi Foundation was held on 16th June 2024. The Pethi Foundation has set a target to achieve/install E Shala in 300 schools benefiting thousands of students year after year from class 1 to 10. The budget for the project is more than Rs 1 Cr and already more than 65 schools have been covered. This inaugural event at Chikkanahalli, Sira Taluk was well attended by all the members from Pethi Foundation- Rtn Velu Pethi, Rtn Reshma Pethi and Rtn Nischeta Pethi, PDG Rajendra Rai & team, President RBJ Suresh Arakere, First lady Rtn Vidya Suresh, Chairman of Sira Satellite club & Rotarian members, Students and Faculty.





The Adult Literacy Project is a Joint project with the Rotary Bangalore West. Rotary Bangalore Junction with the support of Rtn Past President Velu Pethi & President Rtn Suresh Arekere, a total of 7 training centers were inaugurated - 5 in Sira Taluk & 2 in Mandya District. 
