Vice President and President-Elect Rtn. Kamal Karnani inducted the new members, who were pinned by District Governor Rtn. Mahadeva Prasad.

Our news bulletin, Crossing, was released by the Asst.Governor Rtn. Arjun Merwade and this year's Bulletin Editor Rtn. Sushil Agarwal.

The Charter of the new "Rotaract Club of Yenepoya" was presented to the President and members of the club.

President Rtn. Siddharth announced a contribution of \$1,000 to TRF from the Director of Club Service Rtn. Narayan Gupta and a

cheque for the same was presented to the District Governor. President Siddharth's parents donated the sum of Rs.10 lakhs to the Trust Account, a very kind gesture from them.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE

A 5 day Faculty development program was organized by RBJ Vocational Services team in association with 'Reach Much Higher' from July 1st - 5th, 2024 at Yuvaka Sangha, Jayanagar, Bangalore. This 'Train the Trainers' program, which aims to upskill the students for employable skills was held for 20 faculty members from 3 Government universities. The faculty members were trained in "Riddhi" and "Siddhi" programs which were conceptualized by Vocational Services Director Rtn. Dr. O.P.Goel. The course curriculum Trainer kits were distributed to the trainees along with jackets with Rotary logo and water bottles.

The concluding ceremony of the Training program was held on 5th July and the completion certificates were distributed to the trainees by our Past District Governor Rtn. Jitendra Aneja.







Rotary Club of Bangalore Junction has set up a new Skill Development Center in association with "Reach Much higher" at Constituent Degree College, Banaswadi with complete brand concept and course material. This centre was inaugurated by Rtn. Dr. O P Goel, Director of Vocational Service, on 15th July on the occasion of World Youth Skill Day.

The event was attended by Rtn. Ashok Kumar, Chairman of Vocational Training, Mr. Sitesh Bharti, COO of Reach Much Higher, Dr. Beena, the College Principal, Mr. Prabhu, RMH Vice President, representatives from Train Wheel Academy, Vice Chairman Mr. P Jayaseelan, and Mr. R Devaraj from REAL Power Vision, apart from the students and parents. Dr. Goel highlighted the importance of skill-based training linked to employment opportunities, while Rtn. Kumar emphasized Rotary's role in supporting such initiatives.

The program, SIDDHI, targets youth aged 18 to 25, especially school dropouts, and provides three months of job-linked training, including two months of classroom instruction and one month of on-the-job training. Each batch accommodates up to 25 participants, offering support to secure entry-level jobs in the service sector. Participants receive a free student kit containing necessary materials and an ID card. This initiative has an annual capacity to train and employ 100 youths.

Candidate mobilization has begun, with the first batch starting in early August 2024. The college management expressed gratitude to Rotary Club of Bangalore Junction team and Reach Much Higher representatives.

Kudos to Rtn. Dr. O.P. Goel for this great initiative.


ROTARIANS IN THE NEWS
