## AN EVENING OF COMPASSION AND HOSPITALITY ON THE SERENE OUTSKIRTS OF BANGALORE

On the evening of August 21st, 2024, the 100-seat auditorium at the **Sri Madhusudan Sai Institute of Medical Sciences and Research** was filled. Rotarians, primarily from Rotary Bangalore Junction, and their spouses, gathered for a significant occasion — **the inauguration of Rotary Global Grant and Service Projects.**

The event was graced by chief guest Rtn Raju Subramanian, Rotary International Director, in the esteemed presence of the spiritual leader and visionary Sadguru Sri Madhusudhan Sai.

The evening began with a beautifully rendered invocation by the college students, setting a heartfelt tone for the proceedings.

Just before the dignitaries' address, there was a brief ceremony at which the equipments were inaugurated. These included a state-

of-the-art **Heart-Lung Machine, a Dialysis unit, ENT tele-**scopes, and **Operating Microscopes.**

**Dr A R Ragupathy, Director of Sri Madhusudan Sai Institute of Medical Sciences** delivered the welcome address, expressing gratitude towards Rotary. He remarked, "We are gathered not just as professionals but as individuals deeply committed to the betterment of society, to the service of humanity, and to the creation of a world where every soul is treated with dignity, love, and care.

Our President, **Rtn Sidharth Hamirwasia**, welcomed the guests, the dignitaries on the dais, the PDGs in the audience, and P Srinivas of Bangalore Kidney Foundation. He also welcomed Dr Ila Shah, who participated in the event remotely from the USA.





**Rtn Jitendra Aneja, Past Dist Governor**, delivered an enthusiastic and passionate address. He emphasized that the inaugurated project was not mere pieces of equipment but lifelines for people unknown to us.

**Mr Srinivas**, the founder trustee of the Bangalore Kidney Foundation thanked Rotary for their support by establishing 20 dialysis centres. The foundation has so far carried out 500,000 dialysis sessions and 150 transplants.

**Dr. Ila Shah** addressed the audience remotely via video conference, praising the Sri Madhusudan Sai Institute.

**Rtn. Mahadev Prasad, Dist Governor, Rotary International District 3190**, expressed his joy at being part of the event at the esteemed institute, in the presence of Sadguru. He announced his interest in starting two unique banks at the institute—a Human Milk Bank and a Homograft Heart Valve Bank—committing to launching these projects within the year.

**Rtn Raju Subramanian, Director at Rotary International**, opened his speech with salutations to the audience and Sadguru Sai, stating that he felt blessed to be at the institute. He praised Sadguru for establishing a free medical college. He said he would soon announce his commitment to this institute and probably a grant. He highlighted the CMC Vellore initiative for HIV patients, a free center supported by Rotary. On behalf of Rotary, he promised

Sadguru that he would work with him to alleviate the suffering of as many people as possible.

**Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai, a social and spiritual leader** who is spearheading service projects in the areas of Nutrition, Education, and Healthcare, began his address by reciting lines in Sanskrit from an ancient Indian prayer, which he translated for the audience's benefit. "May all be healthy, may all be happy. May all see good and happy things, and no one suffers any sorrow". While he appreciated the donation of the Heart-Lung Machine, he emphasized that more than such machines, what is truly needed are more hearts, like the Rotarians, to carry out their vital work. He shared that they perform more than 30 cardiac surgeries and interventions daily across all their hospitals, mostly for patients below the poverty line.

He appreciated Governor Mahadev Prasad's comments about the human milk bank. Gurujī concluded by revealing plans to create the world's largest free hospital and medical college.

The event concluded with the presentation of a memento to the Gurujī by all past presidents of RBJ, with a citation signed by PDG Aneja, President Sidharth, and Secretary Lalana Murthy, followed by a high tea in an air-conditioned hall with cluster seating. The hospitality was exceptional.

His journey as a medical practitioner, beginning in 1984, highlights his deep commitment to helping others. Since 2004, his dedication has extended to full charity in the medical field, an effort that was especially significant during the COVID-19 pandemic, where he treated over 1,500 patients free of charge, both in person and online.



Beyond his medical practice, he sustains his livelihood through a PP/HDPE Rafia Unit, which supplies bags across India.

Dr. Sarda's passion for writing is another fascinating aspect of his life. He channels his thoughts and emotions into poetry, finding creative expression through words. His book, "**Sandhi**," delves into the poignant emotions a father experiences during his daughter's "विदाई" (farewell after marriage), offering readers a heartfelt glimpse into this significant life event.

Just a little further back, at the previous signal, other boys were busy selling roses, trying to make an honest living.

One day, an inspiration hit me. I stopped at the signal and bought 100 roses from one of the young vendors. Then, I handed the entire bunch to the boy who had been begging and suggested he try selling them instead. I encouraged him to add ₹1 to the usual price for each flower. The next day, I was thrilled to see that he had sold every single rose and made ₹100 profit. His success motivated me to continue buying roses for him to sell in the days that followed.

After a while, the boy started giving me ₹100 every day. Though I never thought of it as a debt he owed me, I accepted the money, understanding that it was important for him to reclaim his self-respect.

Then, suddenly, he disappeared. Curious and concerned, I inquired about him, and to my surprise, I received a letter filled with heartfelt thanks and an invitation. I followed the directions in the letter and found myself standing before a small flower shop. There he was, eagerly waiting to welcome me as the guest of honour, to inaugurate his new business, the flower shop.

That moment was overwhelming. The joy of witnessing his transformation, knowing that a small act of kindness had helped him find a new path in life, was indescribable.

**September is designated as Basic Education and Literacy Month by Rotary**, highlighting one of The Rotary Foundation's Seven Areas of Focus. Basic education and literacy are crucial for reducing poverty, improving health, fostering community and economic development, and promoting peace. Astonishingly, over 775 million people worldwide are illiterate, representing 17% of the global adult population.

Rotary's mission is to enhance the capacity of communities to support education and literacy, address gender disparities in education, and improve adult literacy rates. By empowering educators and inspiring lifelong learning, Rotary clubs around the globe are making a significant impact. Their efforts include:

- Opening new schools;
- Teaching adults to read;
- Introducing innovative teaching methods;
- Promoting healthy school environments.

As Mark Wilson aptly said, "When you teach somebody how to read, they have that for a lifetime. It ripples through the community, one by one."

The impact of education is profound. If all women completed primary education, maternal deaths would decrease by 66%. Additionally, children born to mothers who can read are 50% more likely to survive past the age of five. Furthermore, if every student in low-income countries left school with basic reading skills, 171 million people could be lifted out of poverty, representing a 12% reduction in global poverty.

Rotary clubs worldwide are taking meaningful action to enhance education and literacy in their communities. The Rotary Foundation ensures sustainable access to basic education and literacy by:

- Engaging communities in supporting educational programs;
- Increasing adult literacy rates;
- Addressing gender disparities in education.

Through these efforts, Rotary plays a vital role in advancing basic education and literacy across the globe.

## THE GENESIS OF NITK BHIVE TOASTMASTERS CLUB

In the year 2019-20, during my tenure as Area Director for Area A, District 92 of Toastmasters International, one of my key goals was to start a new club. As I explored potential communities and corporate entities for this initiative, a significant collaboration between Toastmasters International and Rotary International was also underway.



Around the same time, past presidents of Rotary Bangalore Junction, **Rtn. B.K. Krishnamurthy and Rtn. Santosh Kejriwal** was contemplating the idea of launching a Toastmasters club. They approached me with their idea, and I was thrilled to offer my full support in making it a reality.

Rtn. B.K. Krishnamurthy, an alumnus of the National Institute of Technology, Karnataka (NITK), reached out to the owner of BHIVE, also an NITK alumnus, to secure a meeting space. With this collaboration, the **NITK BHIVE Toastmasters Club** was chartered on the 29th Feb, 2020.

The club quickly attracted many members from Rotary Bangalore Junction, providing an excellent platform for future Rotary presidents to hone their public speaking and communication skills. It was an exciting opportunity for me to support this club as a mentor.

Rtn. B.K. Krishnamurthy also enlisted the help of senior Toastmasters from the **MECON Communication Club**, including **Distinguished Toastmasters A.K. Prabhakar and M.U. Bhat**. Their mentorship and educational sessions significantly contributed to the club's success and longevity.

Rtn. B.K. Krishnamurthy was the club's **Charter President** and was succeeded by Rtn. Santosh Kejriwal.

I strongly encourage my fellow Rotarians to visit NITK BHIVE Toastmasters and discover how the club can enhance your communication skills and confidence. This is probably one of the initial Toastmasters clubs formed in collaboration with Rotary.

### What is Toastmasters?

Toastmasters International is a nonprofit educational organization dedicated to building confidence and teaching public speaking skills through a global network of clubs that meet both online and in person. Its founder **Dr. Ralph C. Smedley**, formed the first official Toastmasters club in 1924,
