- **Supporting studies:** Rotary members support studies related to disease prevention and treatment.
- **Helping immunize people:** Rotary members help immunize people against infectious diseases.
- **Improving drinking water:** Rotary members improve drinking water and sanitation infrastructure.

Other events that take place during December include:

- International Day of Disabled Persons on December 3rd

NCWI BANGALORE

For over 100 years, the National Council of Women in India (NCWI; founded in 1919 by Lady Meherbai Tata) has been continuously organizing, through its branches in 16 Indian cities, a wide range of initiatives and programs for the upliftment and empowerment of underprivileged women and children. For the last 56 years, NCWI's Bangalore branch (founded in February 1966), has been spearheading NCWI's mission in Bangalore's Siddapura area.

NCWI is associated with the International Council of Women (ICW; founded in 1888, headquartered in Paris, France), the first truly global women's NGO. ICW played a key role in making sure that the United Nations Charter included women's equal rights, leading to the establishment of the Commission on the Status of Women.

We organize awareness programs on family planning, women's rights, family counselling, AIDS, health & hygiene, domestic violence, small savings, positive parenting, regular HEALTH (eye, dental, general health, etc.) CAMPS and job opportunities for less-educated women and other activities.

Some of the activities undertaken by the National Council of Women in India, Bangalore Branch:

PRE-SCHOOL: NCWI Bangalore runs an active pre-primary school for over 60 very cute children between the ages of 3 and 5 who are provided milk, mid-day meals, books and free uniforms including shoes and school bags.

CERTIFICATE COURSES (6 months):

Tailoring classes are conducted for young girls and ladies who

go on to start their own tailoring unit, or pursue careers in tailoring and garment companies.

 Beautician classes are conducted for young girls and ladies who are all well placed after completion of the course
