Answer: The meaning of 'Service above Self' is 'Prioritising service to society over personal desires'.

NGO-ALERT

In India, countless lives are lost due to the lack of timely and informed help during medical emergencies, such as road traffic accidents, heart attacks, cardiac arrests, strokes, and other incidents. ALERT is an NGO that has been working tirelessly since 2006 to improve the emergency care ecosystem in the country to save lives. With the core objective of promoting golden hour care and emergency response, ALERT collaborates with various governments, hospitals, police Commissioner-ate, the general public, and other stakeholders to generate awareness, build capacity, provide skill training, and advocate for policy changes, the ACAN formed by WHO India with ALERT as one of the Executive members being the latest advancement.

Through its state-of-the-art simulation lab facility (India's first for the general public) and ALERT VoICE (Volunteers In Case of Emergency), a community-driven, technology-based first response network, ALERT pursues the goal set by former President of India **Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam to "train one in every family in emergency response."** To date, ALERT has empowered over 3.6 lakh citizens across the country.

ALERT (www.alert.ngo) has collaborated with the International Club of Rotary since its inception in 2006. Nearly 80% of all Rotary clubs in Chennai have partnered with ALERT on various initiatives, including training programs for Rotarians, Anns, Annettes, Rotaract members, and Inner Wheel wings. Through these collaborations, ALERT's programs have directly benefited over 45,000 individuals approximately.

Some of the key highlights are:

- Comprehensive first aid training sessions conducted for thousands of Rotary members
- Specialized VoICE (Volunteers In Case of Emergency) training on emergency response for Rotaract members, certifying them as community first responders.
- Organizing multiple awareness events such as Walkathons, Alertathon, and Cyclathon in partnership with Rotary to raise awareness about the importance of being trained and prepared.
- Joint community outreach programs focusing on health and safety awareness, including:
 - Training for auto/public and school bus drivers, police, and the general public on first response.
 - Campaigns such as 'Give way to ambulance', 'She needs CPR', and road safety initiatives.
 - Capacity-building initiatives for Rotary club leaders to enhance their skills in crisis management during disasters and accidents.
 - ALERT volunteer Rotary members serving as emergency response team members during Guinness World Record events and major Rotary district events, with ALERT as the first aid partner.
 - Regular updates and refresher courses to keep members informed about the latest first aid techniques and protocols.

ALERT Bangalore Chapter formed in May 2004 led by Rtn. Neeta Agarwal from Rotary Club of Bangalore Junction is taking small but firm steps to continue and expand the noble work started at Chennai. ALERT seeks full support of Rotary Clubs of Bangalore to bring this critical life saving skill to each and every Rotarian in Bangalore and across India.
