

DISTRICT GOVERNOR OFFICIAL VISIT

The full meaning of **GOV** is **Governor Official Visit**. Once a year the District Governor makes an official visit to each club in the District. The schedule is posted on the district website.

The purpose of the visit:

- To allow the District Governor to communicate with the club members:
- To be a useful counsellor to further the Object of Rotary among the clubs in the District and to assist those clubs that may need some guidance;
- To motivate Rotarians to participate in service activities to strengthen the programs of Rotary;
- Bring attention to important Rotary issues as they pertain to both the RI and District levels;
- Recognize the contributions of Rotarians in the club.

Meeting with the Club Executive or Board:

- This meeting takes place prior to or just after the club meeting and generally would last 1 hour; the meeting is presided by the District Governor; the Assistant Governor may wish to introduce the District Governor;
- Records that should be made available and appropriate copies made for the Governor are club goals as entered in Rotary Club Central, current year's board members, budget, prior year's financial statement and copies of the club bulletin.



Meeting Procedure:

- The District Governor and spouse are guests of your club for the Rotary meeting.
- The Governor's presentation is the program for the club and it is not appropriate to schedule any other program that day.
- Encourage members to plan arriving early for the meeting or staying late in order to visit with the District Governor.
- Encourage members to stand when the District Governor is introduced to welcome her and her spouse.
- Presentations to new Paul Harris Fellows, induction of new members and other honors are especially appropriate during the District Governor's visit and the

District Governor should be asked to participate in such events.



Rotary International, one of the world's largest service organizations, celebrated its **120th anniversary on 23rd February 2025.**


The journey began on **February 23, 1905**, when **Paul P. Harris**, a Chicago attorney, convened a meeting with three business acquaintances to form **the first Rotary Club** in downtown Chicago, United States.

The name "Rotary" was chosen because, in its early days, members rotated their weekly club meetings among each other's offices.

Rotary's mission is to "provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders."

A non-political and non-religious organization, Rotary has grown into a global network with over **46,000 clubs** and **1.4** million members, proudly known as Rotarians.

ROTARY'S MARCH THEME



In the Rotary world, March is designated as "*Water and Sanitation Month*", highlighting one of Rotary's key areas of focus. Additionally, March 22nd is recognized as *World Water Day*.

Access to safe drinking water is crucial for all life, yet many around the world still lack this basic necessity. Rotary works tirelessly to address this issue by installing drinking & hand wash stations in schools/villages, drilling wells and providing water filters to those in need. The COVID-19 pandemic has further underscored the importance of sanitation and hygiene, yet many communities still lack access to proper facilities and the education necessary to understand their significance. Rotary steps in to provide both the infrastructure and educational support needed to improve sanitation and hygiene in these areas.

Clean water, sanitation, and hygiene education are fundamental for a healthy environment and a productive life. When people have access to these resources, the impact is profound: waterborne diseases decrease, children stay healthier and attend school more regularly, and mothers can spend less time fetching water, allowing them to focus more on supporting their families. Through water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) programs, Rotary's people of action mobilize resources, forge partnerships, and invest in long-lasting infrastructure and training to bring about sustainable change.

The Rotary Foundation has invested over \$148 million in more than 2,000 Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene projects worldwide. Through these efforts, Rotary volunteers have provided access to safely managed and basic WASH services in communities, schools, and healthcare facilities, all while working to protect and conserve vital water resources.

Rotary Bangalore Junction has consistently been dedicated to supporting water and sanitation projects. RBJ has made a significant impact by constructing toilets and a hand-washing facility at the Government school in our adopted village, Dwaranakunte, Sira Taluk.

As part of the Sahayoga initiative, RBJ contributed **Rs. 1.25 lakh** towards the rejuvenation of Tiptur Lake.

These are just few examples of our commitment to creating healthier communities through focused and impactful initiatives.
