# JULY HIGHLIGHTS

### RCBK's Installation Ceremony

On July 10, 2024, the Rotary Club of Bangalore Koramangala inaugurated Rtn. Anuradha Biswas as the president for 2024-25. She emphasized leveraging technology for community services and promoting gender diversity. District Governor Rtn. Satish Madhavan encouraged impactful projects. The club aims to enhance member engagement with activities like breakfast meetings and virtual gatherings. Initiatives include the Digital Sakhi app for women's empowerment and the Tech Walk for tech enthusiasts. The club also donated a screen reader for the visually impaired. The installation ceremony signaled the start of a new era for the club, committed to making a significant community impact in the coming year.

Routine check-ups and monitoring blood pressure and cholesterol levels are crucial for early detection. Raising awareness empowers individuals to make proactive lifestyle choices for a healthier, longer life.













### Note book distribution to under privileged

As part of our ongoing effort to support education in rural areas, we provided educational kits to 115 primary school children from 12 villages. Each kit was thoughtfully assembled to ensure the children have the resources they need for learning and creativity. The kits included:

- 2 one-line books
- 2 two-line books
- 2 four-line books
- 2 box books
- 3 pencils and 2 erasers
- 2 sharpeners
- 1 drawing book
- 1 set of coloring pencils
- 1 pencil box

For older children, the kits were enhanced with pens, and the schools received geometry boxes to aid in their mathematics education. With a total budget of ₹40,000, this initiative will empower children and foster their educational journey.

### Gubbachi : A Zero Hunger project

Founded in 2015, **Gubbachi** is a Section 8 organization committed to providing educational opportunities to underprivileged children from migrant families. The organization takes a holistic approach by not only focusing on education but also ensuring the well-being of these children through nutritious meals like **Ragi Kanchi**, served **to children of construction workers.** 

In the 2022-2023 period, under the leadership of President Anil, Gubbachi's initiative gained momentum. Generous contributions from Rtn. Manoj, amounting to ₹60,000 in the first year and ₹1,50,000 in the second year, have helped sustain the program. **This year**, a sum of **₹1.25 lakh** has been allocated to cover the expenses for the entire year, ensuring the continuity of this impactful work.











### Career Counselling - Armed Forces

On 20th July 2024, the Rotary Club of Bangalore, Koramangala (RCBK), in collaboration with the Metamorphes Foundation, organized a career counselling session for 80 students from Karnataka Public School (Government), Jeevanbima Nagar. The session aimed to inspire students to consider non-conventional career paths, particularly the Armed Forces.

The session began with an introduction to the Armed Forces, providing insight into the discipline, values, and opportunities it offers. This was followed by a screening of the movie "Saga of Brave Hearts," which showcased the lives and experiences of military personnel. Students actively engaged in Q&A sessions, learning from real-life stories and experiences shared during the session.

By the end, 8-10 students expressed interest in pursuing a career in the Armed Forces and will be referred to the Metamorphes Foundation for further guidance and mentorship.







### Cyber Security Training

Cybersecurity training is essential in schools to safeguard personal data and promote safe online practices. It helps students and staff recognize and prevent cyber threats such as phishing, malware, and cyberbullying. The training includes guidance on creating strong passwords, recognizing suspicious emails, and managing privacy settings.

For staff, it also covers best practices for data security and breach response. By fostering a culture of security awareness, this training makes the school environment more secure and responsible in the digital age.

Raghavendra was the speaker at RCBKs weekly speaker meet. He spoke extensively on Dengue and the importance of overall sustainable health and lifestyle. He interacted with members and answered pertinent questions on Geriatrics and health of the aging population. Overall it was an insightful session for awareness on health.


#### Reach and Resonate Ep 1 & 2

Cybercrime: Risks and Protection for Women in India - by Ann. Anumita Deverajan

Women encounter diverse risks on the internet when it comes to cybercrime, posing a significant threat to their well-being in various aspects of their lives and work. In the modern technological era, one of the most relevant concerns in India is the safety of women's privacy and their personhood as more and more cases of cyber violence affecting women, including cyber sexual harassment, stalking, pornography, threats and blackmail, morphing, fake profiles, defamation, bullying and the publishing of obscene sexual content.

Furthermore, women are discouraged from coming forward to report cybercrimes due to social stigma and the lack of knowledge. These crimes are very challenging for law enforcement agencies to investigate due to technicalities and jurisdiction. Even if these cases get to court, Judicial delays make it even harder for victims to receive justice on time.

The legal solution is available to some extent under the Information Technology Act, 2000 (IT Act) and the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita Act, 2023 (BNS). The law provides remedies for invasion of privacy, sharing of obscene content, stalking and defamation. However, difficulties persist with the current laws and their enforcement. Both "Policing" and "Public Order" come under the state list as given under the Seventh Schedule of the Indian Constitution. The Central Government, however. encourages state activities through advisories and funds and establishing various schemes. The Ministry of Home Affairs had constituted an expert group for the 'Cyber Crime Prevention against Women and Children' (CCWC) to address cybercrime issues comprehensively and recruit cyber consultants to handle online crimes against women and children.



The government also opened a National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (<a href="www.cybercrime.gov.in">www.cybercrime.gov.in</a>) to facilitate the public in reporting cases. This initiative began in 2018 and has witnessed complaints from over 300,000 women. These schemes reflect the government's concern towards cybercrimes, highlighting the significance of the collaborative efforts between the state and central governments to ensure the protection of rights and justice delivery in digital India.


