

ANAEMIA MITIGATION PROJECT BY ROTARY CLUB OF BOMBAY

OVERVIEW

In line with the Government of India's Anaemia Mukt Bharat programme introduced in 2018, the Rotary Club of Bombay has initiated an Anaemia Mitigation Project, which has recently commenced in collaboration with Shrimad Rajchandra Mission Trust (SRMT) and on-ground implementation partner Diganta Swaraj Foundation.

The Anaemia Mitigation Project by the Rotary Club of Bombay extends beyond simply providing medical assistance. By focusing on education, awareness and sustainable solutions, the project aims to create a long-lasting impact on the communities it serves.

The Rotary Club of Bombay aims to reach tribal and rural districts with a high prevalence of anaemia and limited access to medical care facilities. By focusing on schoolchildren, the project is dedicated to making a significant impact on the lives of children in these communities.

SRMT has initiated a holistic approach to anaemia mitigation in the South Gujarat area. So far, they have conducted over 450,000 screenings.

GOING BEYOND BORDERS

The Rotary Club of Bombay is initiating school screenings in Dahanu at Zilla Parishad schools. The club will initially focus on two schools, serving a total of over 14,000 children.

The primary objectives of this programme were to:

- Assess the anaemia status among school-going children and hostel residents.
- Identify high-risk cases requiring urgent medical attention.
- Facilitate early treatment, improve dietary practices, and enhance long-term nutritional outcomes through targeted interventions.

A total of 6,269 students were screened from 79 schools and hostels. The screening included haemoglobin (Hb) testing, basic health checks and referral of severe cases to healthcare facilities.



KEY FINDINGS

Overall Anaemia Burden

<u>Indicator</u>	<u>Count</u>
Total screened	6,269
Mild anaemia	1,225 (19.5%)
Moderate anaemia	4,878 (77.8%)
High-risk (Hb < 7)	53 (0.84%)
Normal (Hb ≥ 12)	113 (1.80%)

Major Observations

- Overall anaemia prevalence is extremely high (above 98%).
- Moderate anaemia is the most

dominant type, affecting nearly 78% of all screened students.

- Only 113 students (1.8%) fall within the normal Hb range, indicating widespread nutritional deficiencies.
- High-risk cases (Hb < 7) constitute 0.84% and require urgent medical management.

HIGH-RISK CASES (HB < 7)

Total high-risk students: 53 (0.85%)

Schools with the Highest High-Risk Burden

- Z.P. School Khaniw – 11 students
- Z.P. School Nikane–Sutarpada – 2 students
- Z.P. School Nikane – 2 students
- Z.P. School Dahyale (Dhangadpada) – 2 students

Several other schools recorded one high-risk case each.

Most high-risk cases were found in remote tribal hamlets (padas), characterised by limited healthcare access, inadequate nutrition and poor awareness of anaemia prevention.

SCHOOLS AND HOSTELS WITH VERY HIGH ANAEMIA LOAD

Schools with 90–100% Moderate Anaemia Prevalence

- Z.P. School Waghadi – 100%
- Z.P. School Khaniw (Savarpada) – 98%+
- Z.P. School Nikavali – 98%
- Z.P. School Koshesari – 97%
- Z.P. School Ambivali (multiple padas) – 95%+

Hostels (Kasa, Wadkun, Agar, Bordi)

- 80–95% moderate anaemia, indicating chronic dietary deficiencies.

INTERPRETATION OF FINDINGS

- 98% of students are anaemic, with only a very small fraction within the normal range.
- Nutritional deficiencies, especially iron and folate, are the primary causes. Adolescent girls, tribal children and hostel residents form the most vulnerable groups.
- High-risk students ($Hb < 7$) require urgent treatment and follow-up by healthcare teams.
- The high concentration of anaemia in hostels suggests structural gaps in diet planning.
- Schools in remote padas show more severe anaemia, indicating:
- Poor access to nutritious food
- Low awareness of anaemia prevention
- Inadequate health-seeking behaviour

RECOMMENDATIONS

Medical Intervention

- Immediate Hb re-testing and medical treatment for all 53 high-risk students.

- Initiation of Iron–Folic Acid (IFA) supplementation for 4,800+ students with moderate anaemia.
- Deworming as per national protocols.
- Linking severe cases to Public Health Centres for supervised treatment.

Nutrition and Diet Improvement

- Improve mid-day meals and hostel diets with iron-rich foods, including:
- Green leafy vegetables, pulses, jaggery and groundnuts
- Weekly jaggery–groundnut laddoos
- Fortified rice or wheat (as applicable)
- Introduction of meal quality monitoring in hostels

Health Education & Behaviour Change

- Menstrual hygiene awareness sessions for adolescent girls
- Weekly nutrition and health education modules in schools
- Parent counselling on low-cost, iron-rich home diets

Strengthening Screening & Monitoring

- Re-screening after three months to monitor progress
- School-wise anaemia dashboards for decision-makers
- Continuous follow-up for high-risk and moderate cases

CONCLUSION

The anaemia screening conducted across 79 schools and hostels reveals a critical public health concern, with over 98% of the 6,269 screened students found to be anaemic. Moderate anaemia is overwhelmingly prevalent, while high-risk cases, though fewer in number, require urgent intervention. The findings underscore the need for immediate medical treatment, dietary improvements and structured nutritional programmes, particularly in hostels and remote tribal padas. With coordinated action by schools, community leaders and partner organisations, a significant reduction in anaemia levels can be achieved over the next six months.






