Rotary Club of Bombay presents the Somchand Parikh Award for Best Teacher to Mr. Ajit Bhoir, Principal of the District W. School, Savaroli



"Today I want to share some thoughts with you about my work as a teacher at an Adivasi school, where students lack even the most basic amenities."

"When I joined the school, 190 students were studying there – or rather, playing there – and I began to think about how we could change the situation."

"We partnered with NGOs, and now our students are studying digitally through their support."

"We've been teaching students the importance of nutrition and health, especially addressing issues like child marriage which is common in our community."

"Along with sports, we've introduced music, dance, and cultural activities to help students connect with the world outside their village."

"We've organised city visits for the students so they can experience life beyond their immediate surroundings."

"Kids in the village should get the same education as kids in cities, so we have introduced modern facilities like robotics, science, and maths labs."

"Now, because of these efforts and changes, 30-35 kids have passed 10th standard and are studying till graduation."

"In the last two years, we've sent about 12 students into nursing, and our aim is to guide even more into professional fields."

"Seeing these changes fills me with satisfaction, and I am immensely proud to be a part of this journey."

Past Trustee Gulam A Vahanvaty on expanding Rotary's reach through peace education

"Rotary's peace centres are designed to promote peace through education."

"The 4th objective of Rotary is to advance goodwill and understanding around the world, effectively promoting peace."

"Peace building and conflict prevention is the first area of focus in Rotary's 7 areas of focus."

"Several Rotarians were involved in making the Charter of the United Nations."

"In 2002, Rotary established 7 peace centres worldwide."

"We now have 5 Centres for Masters Education spread across the world."

"The certificate programme is designed for slightly senior people who cannot commit to long-term study."

"Our certificate programme is giving us more bang for our buck, costing about £11,000 compared to £86,000 for the Masters Fellowship."

"We've had over 117 peace fellows approved, spending over £85 million."

"Rotary's peace centres are entirely funded by the Rotary Foundation, including airfare, boarding, and lodging."

"India has consistently produced peace fellows, many working in global institutions like the UN, WHO, and World Bank."

"The peace centres programme is exclusively for candidates recommended by Rotary."

"Rotarians are not eligible for the programme, but Rotaractors are."

"Rotary recently established its first peace centre in Africa at Makerere University in Uganda."

"Rotary is expanding its peace centres to the MENA region, with the first centre in Turkey."

"Symbiosis University in Pune and a university in Seoul are shortlisted to be Rotary's new peace centre in Asia."

"Rotary has developed a substantial endowment worth almost £200 million to fund its peace programmes."

"The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation contributes £2 for every £1 Rotary raises for polio eradication."

"There are only two countries in the world where polio remains endemic: Afghanistan and Pakistan."

RCB inaugurates new dialysis centre at Mallika Hospital



On September 1st, 2024, the Rotary Club of Bombay, in collaboration with Mallika Hospital, inaugurated the Mallika – Rotary Dialysis Centre. The facility was opened by donor and PP Vijay Kumar Jatia, with four new dialysis machines donated by Rtn. Ptn. Gauri and PP Vijay.

Key attendees included President Satyan Israni and ARRFC and PDG Sandip Agarwalla among others. Mallika Hospital's team was represented by Dr. Sharad Sheth, Managing Director and Nephrologist, alongside Drs. Keshnath Chauhan and Roshan Jha.

This new centre, housed within the 25-machine dialysis unit at Mallika Hospital, is a significant step in addressing the rising demand for affordable dialysis services in Mumbai. The hospital already provides free dialysis and subsidised fistula surgeries, with its cardiac care unit offering discounted angiography and angioplasty procedures.

The addition of the four dialysis machines will increase capacity to serve underprivileged patients. The Rotary Club of Bombay expressed sincere gratitude to Rtn. Jatia for his generous contributions. Guests were presented with mementos, flowers, and shawls as tokens of appreciation.

SUPERMARKET FIELD TRIP FOR LIGHTHOUSE

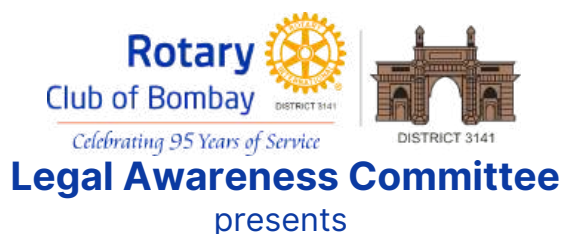
