Union Budget 2024: Major changes in Capital Gains Tax regime. Holding period, Tax rates explained. The theme of the direct tax proposals was growth and simplification and rationalisation of various income tax provisions.

This budget, which was presented by the Finance Minister Ms Nirmala Sitaraman on July 23rd, 2024, had a lot of tweaks on the capital gains side. It was also historic because the indexation benefit was removed.

Union Budget Proposal:

CAPITAL GAINS TAX Holding Periods:

Simplified to 12 months for all Listed Securities, Units of Equity Oriented Mutual Funds & Units of Business Trust and 24 months for other assets.

For all listed securities, units of equity-oriented mutual funds and units of business trusts holding period is simplified to 12 months and for all other assets to 24 months.

Union Budget Proposal:

- Long-term capital gain tax for all assets at 12.5%.
- · Short-term capital gain tax at 20% for Listed Sec1urities, Units of Equity Oriented Mutual Funds & Units of Business Trust and applicable rates tor other assets.
- Unlisted bonds/debentures treated like MILDs, taxed at applicable rates.
- *Indexation Benefit: Removed for long-term assets.*

Regarding the rates, the long-term capital gain for all assets has been changed to 12.5%. The short-term capital gain tax for listed securities; units of equity oriented mutual funds &units of Business trust is now 20% and applicable rates for other assets

Indexation benefits for long term assets have been removed.

The budget also raised the exemption limit for capital gains to Rs 1.25 lakh annually which was earlier 1 lakh per year.

Let's discuss the impact of the removal of indexation











benefits on Immovable properties. They earlier had the provision of indexation if held for more than 24 months and were taxed at 20% while short term was MMR. The indexation benefit is now removed, the LTCG is 12.5% for period of holdings above 24 months. This has

Union Budget Proposal:

START-UPS AND CHARITABLE TRUSTS

• *Abolition of Angel Tax:*

Provisions abolished to promote start-ups.

• Charitable Trusts:

Simplified procedures and reduced administrative burdens under Sections 11-13.

The abolition of Angel tax is a welcome step.

Union Budget Proposal:

Additional Provisions

• Specified Mutual Fund (SMF) Redefinition:

Funds investing >65% in debt/money market instruments.

• *Increased NPS Deduction for Employers:*

Deduction limit increased to 14% under the

New Tax Regime.

• GIFT City:

New exemptions for retail and ETF funds, and new Variable Capital Company structure.

The budget has redefined the Specified mutual fund category. Now funds investing more than 65% in debt /money market instruments are classified as Specified Mutual fund. Further if these were bought on or after 1st April 2023, they will attract MMR irrespective of the period of holding.

For NPS – under the New Tax regime the deduction limit (amount of employer contribution amount) has been increased from 10% to 14% - which is a welcome step.

The holding period/ tax rate changes have made some investments attractive or unattractive.

Some Examples:

- 1. Arbitrage fund category, which was favoured by individuals and corporates alike, now faces higher STCG at 20% vs 15% earlier".
- 2. "Listed REITs (Real Estate Investment Trusts) and INVITs (Infrastructure Investment Trusts) become attractive due to changes in the holding period that has been condensed to 12months. This asset class is fast emerging and is being used by investors who want

to invest and diversify into real estate and infrastructure assets"

- 3. "Debt Mutual funds which are bought on of after 1st April 2023 now attract MMR irrespective of the holding period. This has made them quite unattractive. However, an interesting point here is that they attract capital gains only on redemption unlike Fixed deposits.
- 4. Sovereign Gold Bonds are in for a rejoice because now if they are held for more than 12 months, they will attract LTCG. If held till maturity its tax free.
- 5. As a result of the change in definition of the Specified Mutual funds, some funds that were Specified earlier but are not specified now, they become attractive due to the change in the holding period and LTCG"

There is a landscape in terms of assets that benefit and those that do not. However, asset allocation should not always be based on taxation. It has to be based on your life journey, the risks, and liabilities you foresee."

Union Budget Proposal Conclusion:

- Effective Dates:
- Most amendments effective from 1st April 2024.
- Specific provisions from 1st October 2024, 1st January 2025 and 1st April 2025.
- Capital Gains, Buyback, and NPS changes effective from 23rd July 2024, 1st October 2024, and 1st April 2024 respectively.

Sangkoo Yun will be RI President for RY 2026-27

Sangkoo Yun, of the Rotary Club of Sae Hanyang, Seoul, Korea, is the Nominating Commitee's selection to become Rotary International's President for 2026-27. He will be officially declared President Nominee on September 15th, 2024, if no other candidates challenge him.

Yun received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Syracuse University School of Architecture in the U.S. and an honorary doctoral degree from The University of Edinburgh, Scotland.

He is the founder and CEO of Dongsuh Corp., which engineers and markets architectural materials, and the president of Youngan Corp., which operates in real estate and financial investment. He is involved in many civic organisations and has a special interest in the preservation of cultural heritage.

A Rotary member since 1987, when he was a charter member of the Rotary Club of Sae Hanyang, Yun has served Rotary International as a director, trustee, committee member and chair, and RI learning facilitator. He served for eight years as co-chair of the Keep Mongolia Green Project, by Korean members of Rotary.

His RI committee roles include the Board Administration Committee (2013-15, vice chair 2014-15), the International Assembly Committee (vice chair, 2020-21), and the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee (regional vice chair, 2023-27). He also served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (2019-22, chair 2020-21) and Programmes Committee (2019-22, chair 2020-22).

Yun received The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service Award in 2021-22. He was appointed an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth II, awarded the Friendship Medal by the President of Mongolia, and recognised for distinguished services by the President and Prime Minister of Korea. He is a veteran of the Republic of Korea Army and an emeritus elder at Andong Presbyterian Church.

Yun and his spouse, Eunsun, are Rotary Foundation Benefactors, Major Donors, and members of the Arch Klumph Society, the Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society. They have two children.


Ananda Yaan Chairman Kaushal Mehta welcomed the guests and highlighted the diverse range of activities that the underprivileged






