





The evening concluded on a high note, leaving everyone inspired and energized to embark on the New Year with renewed zeal for service and fellowship.













My Cancer Journey

December in Rotary is "Disease Prevention & Treatment" month. I finally relented to our gorgeous from inside out Flyover Editor's gentle persistence for an article about my cancer journey. My initial reaction was to not relive that dark period of my life, but I however felt that sharing it would be a lesson for the readers to not be naïve enough (as I was) to think that "only other people get cancer".

I had always had hormonal issues since youth, but we were still in an era when "getting married and having children" would sort it out. Going through the grind of life, profession and family – one forgets about health. As age and youth give you abundant resilience, you keep going through the motions of daily living - UNTIL, DISEASE HITS YOU. Doctors are really the worst patients who do not take care of their own health mostly, and having a family of doctors around you all the more blinds you.

One day I had a sudden severe pain in my left breast. We had just lost my mother in a road traffic accident and with so much to be done, I did not bother. I told my husband when it happened again. My usually stoic husband insisted I get a mammography. He had been advising me to do so since I had my Hysterectomy at 40. I, who worked in a tertiary care hospital, could have just walked into the Radiology unit but did not. Why? Because "Only our patients get cancer!". Only in the last decade and a half, intense research all over the world is linking various causative factors – genetics, hormonal imbalances, anemia, thyroid issues, oral contraceptive pills, extreme stress, environmental pollution – and I had at least 3 of the above causative factors – AND I STILL IGNORED IT.

This sudden sharp pain came as a huge warning sign. December 31, 2013 – at 7 am Husband insisted on driving me to my clinic to see a waiting patient and then straight for the Mammogram. My classmate, a famous breast surgeon was waiting. Of course, the left breast only had a huge cystic lesion she said that was causing pain, and would resolve with meds. And by the time I was thinking "see nothing at all", she started screening the absolutely normal right breast. The sudden eerie silence and a palpable emotion on both their faces made me look up at the monitor – and there it was – a silent 3 cm dumbbell shaped tumor, extremely vascular, BIRAD 4, and definitely malignant. An immediate biopsy was done. Even then I was only upset with them for doing the painful biopsy and ruining my New Year's Eve plans. DENIAL! By evening it slowly sunk in.

After an agonizing wait, the official biopsy result came on Jan 3rd. My treatment was planned by my surgeon friend here, my senior Oncosurgeon friend in New Delhi (who came to operate), and my overzealous brilliant husband. My mind had shut off totally and I could not process anything at all. I begged them to chop both sides off fully like Angelina Jolie. My tumor pathology was aggressive, would only moderately respond to treatment, and chances of recurrence was high. Even though PET scan was done, we would not know the spread status in the axillary nodes until post-surgery biopsy. Funnily enough, surgery itself is known to cause spread of cancer in the body.

Surgery was done and I went home in 24 hours. Much to my dismay, only a partial Mastectomy was done. WHYYYY??? Was I going to participate in MRS INDIA contest? But both my surgeons said no indication again. My overall good health due to healthy eating and sports helped the wounds to heal well and in 4 weeks the chemotherapy started. All cancer survivors agree that the treatment is actually more traumatic than the disease. I had prepared myself mentally by chopping off my long curly locks and waited for the inevitable. 12 days after chemo your nails and teeth start turning black. 14 to 16 days after chemo your hair starts coming out in clumps in your fingers. Even your eyebrows and eyelashes fall. I refused to wear a scarf or wig. Knowing these will happen still does not prepare you for the intense emotions you feel when your hair falls out. "Chemo brain" was the most debilitating and frustrating. I lost 40% of my memory according to the assessment. I had aphasia where I could not verbalize my thoughts and all this is technically called cognitive impairment or cognitive dysfunction. This is attributed to the chemicals released by the targeted drugs that kill fast multiplying cells like nerves and brain cells







The 3rd and 4th chemo's brought out such strong side effects that I had to be constantly hospitalized. Hallucinations and insomnia post chemo was a curse. My white cell count (normal is 4000 to 11000) started falling to 100 and 200 on day 3, and I would have to inject myself with Neupogen every day and go on antibiotics. Hubby was terrified of injecting me, and I refused to go to the hospital by then. My son had just failed in his 12th pre boards and I would lie down on the living room sofa with my IVs to monitor his tuitions. How could I go into sterile isolation when my sons needed me? God is great. And No family to help except my elderly uncle and aunt.

The chemos were stopped at 4 cycles due to lack of tolerance, and 2 weeks later the radiations started - 30 days, 30 sittings. I got allocated a special 6 am slot (thanks to my college senior) so I could finish before other patients came. By the end of the month, it was a struggle to stay motivated, eat and continue to survive. However precise and focused software planned targeted radiation is given, surrounding tissues suffer, and that part of your body is cooked! Well, finally the 6 months of treatment were over. It took nearly 2 years for the body to get back to normal and counts to come up. And slowly but steadily, one got into the groove of a "normal" life with new burden of treatment induced diabetes. I challenged myself by going on a nearly solo trip to Japan 1 year later and completed an MBA from ISB just to prove to myself that my brain had not vegetated.

It is a very emotional journey and all the survivors I have met relate to these emotions. When we meet, we just hug and cling to each other in silent empathy. My surgeon friend wanted me to motivate others in her support groups just as I motivated myself, but I could not bring myself to do that. However, I work hard through various NGOs to ensure that poor women are able to afford free screening and treatment. I have helped Rotary to plan and execute 3 Mammography bus projects for free screening, the first one while still undergoing my treatment. Cancer is on the rise and the only way to fight it is through awareness and early diagnosis.

I could have copy pasted generic information from the internet about cancer for this article, and you dear reader would not have searched for information about cancer to read. Sharing my story is my way of getting you to read more about cancer and take care of yourself. The take aways from this piece for you my dear readers: .

1. Do not neglect your health. 2. Be aware. 3. Do not ignore signs and symptoms. 4. Be healthy, eat healthy and exercise. Enjoy life as it is too short but avoid excesses. 5. Annual checkups are mandatory after age 40. If there is a family history of anything, then much earlier. 6. Self-breast exam, Pap smear and mammography for women over 40 years. 7. Did you know that Prostate cancer is more common in men in India than breast cancer in women? So, dear men, make sure after 40 your checkups include PSA testing. 8. And finally, NEVER give up
