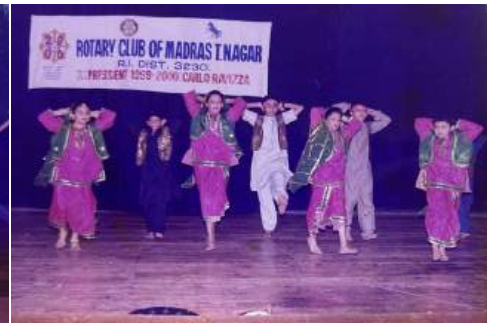

FLASHBACK: ROTARY CLUB OF MADRAS T. NAGAR (RCMT)

Chartered in May 1986 | A Legacy of Fellowship & Service

The Rotary Club of Madras T. Nagar was chartered in May 1986, with the inaugural meeting held at Hotel Savera. Rtn. R. Krishnamoorthy served as the Charter President, leading a club that upheld the core values of Rotary with pride. In those early days, membership was strictly by invitation, and selections were made following personal interactions by the club committee—even if proposed by members of the parent club, Rotary Club of Madras Southwest.

Back then, about 80% of the members hailed from the same locality, building a strong, close-knit community. Attendance was taken very seriously, with many members striving for 100% participation. If a meeting was missed, members were encouraged to attend sessions at other Rotary clubs to "make up" their attendance—complete with a signed attendance card! While such practices may seem old-fashioned now, they laid the foundation for strong inter-club bonding and a culture of accountability.
