

- The total expense incurred was ₹5,34,000/-.



### Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam

Ayam Nijah Paro Veti Ganana Laghucetasam) (Udaracaritanam Tu Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam) Meaning: He is mine, and the other is a stranger, thinks the mean minded. Whereas the broad minded thinks the whole world is one family and one race.

This Sanskrit phrase from \*MahA upanishad\*, says "The world is one family". How can we substantiate this verse to our understanding, when the color, creed, land and language is varied?

My recent travel to the United States gave me an eye opening thought into the value of this saying.

As both our children are in the US, we plan to visit them every year. So this year, during the \*mahAlayPaksham\* period that is considered to be the time for remembering our ancestors and forefathers, we performed the "mahalaya tharpanam" or the offering on the thithi, such that they are appeared before we set off on our journey to the US.

As we landed here, I was awestruck to see the same concept being adhered by the western world as well. Yes!, I am mentioning about \*HALLOWEEN\*. Every house is decorated with the most scariest skeletons and the macabre nature of depictions, in remembrance of the dead, including saints (hallows), martyrs and the departed. Isn't this one proof enough to say that the human race follows the same belief beyond boundaries??

In Europe I presume, especially in Britain and Ireland, "Souling", is observed along the same lines to the present day "trick or treat", where the poor would go from door to door offering prayers for the deceased in exchange for 'soul cakes'. We in our faith too have Diwali, the festival of lights, that has a similar belief of bursting crackers and lightning diyas for our ancestors who had descended. The inference is that, we who live in this world, referred as \*VASUDHA\*, are of one single family.
