







Rotary International News

Summary of PresidentR. Gordon R. McInally's message for the month of November 2023:

Rotary International is set to launch a new peace center in partnership with Bahçeşehir University (BAU) in Istanbul, focusing on supporting peacebuilding efforts in the Middle East and North Africa. Recruitment for the first cohort of Rotary Peace Fellows at BAU begins in 2024, with the 2024 Rotary International Convention marking the 25th anniversary of the Rotary Peace Centers program. This program has trained over 1,700 peace fellows worldwide, who have made tangible contributions to promoting peace.

Rotary Peace Fellows, like Jennifer Montgomery and Gorett Komurembe, demonstrated their remarkable impact through the co-founding of the Magenta Girls Initiative in Uganda, empowering young women to triumph over diverse challenges. Additionally, Ndzi Divine Njamsi from Cameroon, upon finishing the Rotary Positive Peace Activator training program, shared his insights on Positive Peace.

The importance of nurturing peace efforts through the promotion of Rotary's fellowship is underscored, alongside the encouragement for collaboration with graduated peace fellows and support for Rotary's peace centres globally. A notable contribution of \$15.5 million from the Otto and Fran Walter Foundation facilitated the establishment of the program at BAU, further emphasizing the significance of financial backing for Rotary's initiatives.

The new Rotary Peace Center at BAU will provide a one-year professional development certificate in peace and development studies, focusing on peacebuilding in the Middle East and North Africa. President Fordon concludes by highlighting the ongoing commitment required for peacebuilding and the importance of taking steps together in this journey.

Jawahar Nichani, the former president of RC Madras South, undertook a flagship project to provide inclusive and quality education to children, including those with special needs, during his tenure. Collaborating with speech pathologist Kalpana Kumar, they identified eight government-aided schools for the project named "Freedom through Education." Several parameters were considered to select the schools, focusing on their management, facilities, and willingness to accommodate special needs children.

Equipping the schools with specialized equipment and services for children with various disabilities. To fund the initiative, they raised approximately ₹85 lakh, largely through donations from various sources. The initiative aimed to integrate special needs children into mainstream education and encompassed hiring special educators, speech pathologists, behavioral therapists, and psychologists. Through this holistic approach, the project aimed to facilitate academic and medical rehabilitation, ensuring the children's overall development. The involvement and support of RC Madras South members were crucial in the success of this unique and impactful initiative.



Inauguration at Ayyapanthangal School

The splendid inauguration of the newly constructed toilet block, refurbished laboratory, and the addition of compound walls with a main gate and lighting at the Government Higher Secondary School in Ayyappanthangal was held on 17th October. This project was made possible through the CSR grant from Fourrts (India) Labs Pvt. Ltd, facilitated by Rtn. AKS. Dr. S. V. Veeramani. The esteemed presence of our district governor, Rtn. AKS. Ravi Raman, alongside several dedicated Rotarians, added a special touch to the event. We extend our gratitude to the project chairman, Rtn. Kannan Paramasivam, for his unwavering dedication and consistent follow-ups that ensured the successful and timely completion of the project.

Below is a brief summary of the project events, as recounted by the project chairman, Rtn. Kannan Paramasivam.

- •In September 2022, Rtn. Dr. Ragavan's request for support for a school initiated the project, emphasizing the value of community engagement.
- After consultations with IPP Dr. Nishant and a subsequent site visit, the ground work for the project began, showcasing collaboration and communication.
- •In December 2022, the matter was brought up in the board meeting, resulting in the unanimous decision to prioritize the construction of the toilet unit, amounting to approximately 4 lakh rupees. Of this amount, 1.70 lakh rupees were allocated from the district grant, with Rtn Senthil generously pledging a minimum of 1 lakh rupees towards the project. We express our sincere gratitude to Rtn Senthil for his kind generosity and unwavering support.
- •In March '23, during the toilet project, Rtn Veeramani Sir expressed interest in the school's status and needs after viewing a News 7 channel video. This led to the initiation of a Rs. 20 lakh CSR project, requiring a revision and reworking of the existing plan to meet the financial year-end deadline.
- This proposal was supported by consistent site visits from Rtn Jayaraman, showcasing immeasurable support.
- •Rtn Thiyagarajan managed the Rotary International paperwork, exhibiting dedicated support.
- President Rtn Venkat Raghava and Secretary Rtn Kumaravel provided crucial support and autonomy, demonstrating trust and empowerment.
- •Mr. Tamilarasan, the contractor, played a pivotal role in executing various construction tasks for the school, demonstrating dedication and excellence.



Asian Games 2022

The 2022 Asian Games, officially known as the 19th Asian Games, took place in Hangzhou, China, from 23rd September to 8th October 2023. Originally scheduled for September 2022, the event was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and later rescheduled for 2023. Hangzhou became the third Chinese city to host the Asian Games, following Beijing in 1990 and Guangzhou in 2010. The Games celebrated the 110th anniversary since the inception of the first continental event, the 1913 Far Eastern Championship Games.

The emblem, "Surging Tides" (Chinese: 潮涌; pinyin: Cháoyǒng), representing a traditional hand fan from Zheijang, a running track, the Qiantang River tidal bore, and radio waves, was unveiled in 2018. It aimed to reflect the growth of socialism with Chinese characteristics and the unity of the OCA. The Games' mascots, Congcong, Lianlian, and Chenchen, collectively known as "Memories of Jiangnan," were introduced in 2020. Each mascot represented a different aspect of Hangzhou's cultural heritage and technological advancement.

The official motto, "Heart to Heart, @Future," symbolized the connectivity among the participating Asian countries. The Asian Games in Hangzhou were a celebration of cultural heritage, technological advancement, and the spirit of unity among the participating nations.

India at the Asian Games 2022

India participated in the 2022 Asian Games, initially scheduled for September 2022 but postponed to September-October 2023 due to the COVID-19 situation in China. The country achieved its best-ever medal tally, surpassing the previous record of 70 medals from the 2018 Asian Games. With a historic milestone, India crossed the 100-medal mark, joining China, Japan, and South Korea as the fourth nation to do so.

In various disciplines, India showcased exceptional performances, excelling in Archery, Kabaddi, Cricket, and Field Hockey, and securing the second-best position in Athletics, Shooting, and Squash. Notably, India clinched its first-ever gold in badminton, marking a significant triumph in the sport. Additionally, Indian athletes set multiple world records in the field of shooting, underscoring the country's growing prowess in the sport.

Furthermore, the Men's field hockey team's gold medal win secured India's automatic qualification for the 2024 Summer Olympics, adding another milestone to the nation's sporting achievements.
