Apart from the above projects, Rtn.Ranjith is working on a Global Grant to provide Life Saving Equipments to the Departments of Neo Natal and Cardiology in the Egmore Childrens Hospital. The value of the projects is estimated to be around USD 35K.

Collectively projects worth USD 1,60,00 are in the pipeline.

Delighted to share the news, that the boy from Salem, eleven year old Aadhavan was selected to go for the finals in the Silambam Competetion held in Qatar approached us through our Special Projects Director Rtn.Senthilnathan for sponsorship for his travel expenses. A Felicitation is being planned for him by our club in the near future.




The District Diwali Celebrations was meaningfully spent with destitute elders by sponsoring new cloths and a special feast. Guess some of our members contributed to this cause.



The Golden Doorway of Bakthapur is made of brick and embossed in copper gilt and has been described as "The Richest piece of Artwork" in the whole kingdom of Nepal in olden days.

The door was made by 3 Shakya men (The Shakya people are from the Newar community, whose members claim a relationship to the clan to which Buddha belonged)

Percy Brown from London in "Picturesque Nepal" in 1912 wrote about the Golden Door "A specimen of man's handicraft, it creates a standard whereby may be measured the intellect, artistic and religious of the old Newar
