

<u>Residual Skill Development Centre, TV Nagar School, Ambattur, Chennai</u>

On September 16th 2025, the Rotary Club of Ambattur reached a major milestone with the inauguration of the first floor of the Rtn. Panchapakesan Centenary Block, a 10,000 sq. ft. modern facility that will also house a Vocational Skill Development Centre for youth and women.

The project, seeded two years ago with CSR contributions from M/s ATOS (Rs. 30 Lakhs) and M/s Heat & Control (Rs. 10 Lakhs), has now taken shape as a larger initiative. The 1st Floor was inaugurated by Mr. Michael Kollar, Global Head of Cloud & Modern Infra Business Unit, Atos, in the presence of Rotarians and Atos representatives from across India.

The dignitaries were shown around the school; they went through **the Science lab**, **the Genie lab**, **the STEM lab**, and **the Computer lab**. They also saw a couple of **classrooms with smart boards**. They were impressed with the experiments shown by the students and asked them several questions.

After the ceremonial inauguration, done by Mr. Michael Kollar, the gathering was welcomed by Rtn. Parasuram, the President of the Rotary Club of Ambattur. He discussed the history of the club and mentioned how the Stalwarts of the club initiated these major projects. He paid tribute to Rtn. Panch, Rtn. Thiru, Rtn. Kalro & Rtn. Vasu Bhatia, who initiated & helped sustain these projects through the nascent stages. He also mentioned that the next generation took it to greater heights, and this is the result of their efforts.

Rtn Hariprasad, the Correspondent of the school, informed the gathering on the history of the school and its functioning.

The event also saw the felicitation of the representatives of ATOS, the contractor, and the school's Admin Head, **Ms. Meenal**.

There was a wonderful cultural program presented by the students of the TV Nagar school.

Mr. Michael Kollar & Mr. Sriram, in their addresses, were all praise for the school and especially the students. He wanted us to start a course on coding for the students.

The Centenary Block is expected to be finished by December & will comprise a stilt + 3 floors, where the stilt will have the offices.

The Meeting ended with a **Vote of thanks by Mr. Prashanth**. It was followed by a sumptuous lunch.



















Ayappakam After School Learning Centre - "Say No to Drugs" Walkathon

The RCA After School Learning Centre, Ayappakam in association with New Chance Rehabilitation Centre, organized a "Say NO to Drugs" Walkathon on September 21st 2025, to spread awareness on the harmful effects of drug use and promote a drug-free lifestyle.

Students collected information on drug abuse among youth and shared strategies for prevention. The walk covered **1.7 km from the Centre to Kanopus Park**, with participants proudly carrying handmade posters and banners. The program also featured motivational talks, student presentations, a pledge, and cultural celebrations.

Our **Chief Guest, Mr. R. Rathish, Founder of New Chance**, along with his team, addressed the gathering and shared valuable insights from his experiences.











September 16th 2025 - Speaker Meeting

The meeting commenced with **President Rtn. T. Parasuram** warmly welcoming the gathering.

Our speaker for the week was **Ms. Srividya Gopinath** from the **Saaisha India Foundation**, founded by **Ms. Jayshree Ratan**, inspired by a relative's journey with breast cancer.

Ms. Srividya introduced us to the Foundation's remarkable initiatives — crafting crocheted breast prostheses (fondly called "Knockers") for women who have undergone mastectomy, and soft beanies for children under 12 undergoing chemotherapy.

These handmade prostheses and beanies, lovingly created by skilled volunteers who are avid crocheters and knitters, are provided free of cost to beneficiaries — restoring comfort, confidence, and dignity.

She also shared about their upcoming project, "Octopus", specially designed for neonatal wards.

25 Years of RCA Microcredit - A Legacy of Compassion

RCA already had the Rotary Hospital, TV Nagar School, and SCAW as its long-term service projects. Our signature fundraiser *Dandiya* had just been launched a year earlier and was quickly gaining strength. The Anns of RCA, always working shoulder to shoulder with Rotarians in every initiative, longed for a project that they could call their very own. To fill this need, the *Microcredit Project* was initiated in 1999–2000, during the presidentship of Rtn. Satyan Bhatt.

The initiative was led by Ann Parul Bhatt, who provided the seed capital with the support of a few RCA Rotarians, notably Rtn. Ajit Patel. A small contribution from Dandiya was also added. And thus, the microcredit project was born — a project that went on to touch countless underprivileged and needy families.

The microcredit project has touched **countless underprivileged families.** It began by funding small livelihoods — an idli cart, ironing boxes, sewing machines, and other basic tools. Over time, its scope expanded to cover tuition fees, two-wheelers for commuting, house repairs during the Varadha floods, and even funeral expenses. Today, it is most often used to support education, helping parents pay school and college fees for their children.

In its early days, recipients would attend RCA speaker meetings to receive their cheques or in-kind assistance. A memorable moment was when ace cricketer Krishnamachari Srikkanth handed over sewing machines, leaving the beneficiaries both awestruck and overjoyed. These occasions also allowed RCA members to witness first-hand the impact of the project.

Now, as we step into the **25th year of microcredit**, let us reflect on its journey. While the project is under the banner of RCA, the responsibility of finances, selection of recipients, and record maintenance lies with two Ann signatories. At the close of every Rotary year, accounts are carefully prepared, verified, and handed over to the incoming President and First Lady. These are also shared transparently with all Anns on the RCA and the Anns WhatsApp group.

When the project began, it was managed by Ann Saraswathi Ramdas and Ann Renuka Sasi Kumar. After Ann Saraswathi stepped down, Ann Tara Rao took over and has now been managing it with dedication for nearly 18 years. Following Ann Renuka's resignation, Ann Mala joined five years ago. Today, **Ann. Tara and Ann. Mala** continues to carry forward this responsibility with the same commitment.

To date, the microcredit project has supported about **1,100 recipients**, with nearly **₹8 lakhs** in circulation. These are completely *interest-free loans*, extended to deserving candidates recommended by an Ann or Rotarian, who also stand as guarantors to ensure timely repayments. Remarkably, in 25 years, there have been *no bad debts*.

For all of us who have been associated with microcredit, it has been a deeply rewarding experience. As the saying goes: "The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others." This truth has been lived not only by Saraswathi, Renuka, Tara, and Mala, but also by every Ann and Rotarian who took the effort to recommend and support a needy family.

Let us continue to be a source of hope for those in need, comfort for the lonely, and gratitude for the opportunity to serve through Rotary.
