
### **Smart Vision Glasses Donation**








# Installation of Interact Club of KRMM school

# Fun Facts about Rotary

The Rotary Wheel was initially used by the first Rotary Club in Chicago and symbolized civilization and movement. In 1912, it was validated by the Association of Rotary Clubs and "Rotary International" was added to the wheel. A new wheel was adopted in 1929, which is still used today.

#### The wheel includes:

- 6 spokes
- 24 teeth symbolizing the spirit of service at any hour of the day
- A keying groove to lock the wheel on its axis and make it functional

Birth of the Four-Way Test: The Four-Way Test, one of Rotary's guiding principles, was created by Chicago Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932. He intended it to be a moral code for employees of his company, the Club Aluminum Products Company, during a time of economic hardship.

The President's Collar does more than gleam under meeting lights. Each gold-plated link represents continuity of leadership, a quiet promise that every president serves for a year but stewards a legacy that began in 1905.

When the collar is placed on a new leader, the whole club renews its commitment to shared purpose, teamwork and accountability. It is Rotary's wordless reminder that leadership is service, not status.
