

SMART VISION PROJECT



Radhatri Nethralaya Diabetic Retinopathy Project in association with Rotary. Loss of vision can affect physical health, increasing risk of falls and quality of life. It also has a big impact on mental health. Loss of vision has been linked to loneliness, social isolation, and feelings of worry, anxiety, depression and fear.

Radhatri Nethralaya under the able guidance of Rtn Dr. Vasumathy and Dr. Praveen have been working to change lives through the prevention and treatment of avoidable blindness. RADAR is Radhatri Nethralaya's diabetic retinopathy project in association with Rotary. A month-long screening of Diabetic Rotarians & their family members at Radhatri Nethralaya.

In tandem is a month-long free screening of the public for diabetic retinopathy using a non-invasive AI based retinal camera in public places, parks and camps. Leaflets are also widely distributed to build an awareness of this condition. The aim, as Rtn Dr Vasumathy explained, is to help patients diagnosed with diabetes, detect early retinal changes so as to reduce the risk of deterioration and prevent blindness.

Season 11 of Project RADAR was flagged off at Radhatri Nethralaya on November 9, 2023 by District Governor Rtn. Raviraman who graced the occasion as chief guest. Also present was Rtn. Sai Krishna, District Director, Community Service - Health, as guest of honour. President Rtn. Binoy, Secretary Rtn. Jayashree, along with Rtn Prasad, spouse Dr. Praveen and spouse Prithviraj represented RC Chennai Towers for this project.
















BLOOD DONATION CAMP






