

Speaker for the evening on October 12, 2023, was the young and vibrant Ms. Raushni Khanna who joined us to talk on mental health. Ms Khanna, a Psychology Major from Christ University, Bengaluru and a practising Counsellor at Chennai, has helped many clients and conducted various 'Mental Health Awareness' sessions for corporates and colleges.

Today, where a simple disappointment is termed depression, where being virtually accepted takes precedence over physical and familial relationships, comment on appearance even with good intentions is termed "body shaming", constant peer pressure of the so-called liberal society, and many such scenarios...



The primary focus for the evening was on the requirement of scientific counselling and Mental Therapy. How a qualified therapist plays a significant role in today's nuclear family world. 

#### - WHEN CHENNAI STOOD TALL


