




























# ROTARY FRIENDSHIP EXCHANGE FELLOWSHIP, UGANDA





For years she has been the creative head of our bulletin, doing her work silently and bringing in new ideas adapting from TYPEWRITER era to DIGITAL era! Here she is, sharing her experiences with us.

In 1998, when Venket and I along with Charter President Sabu, First lady Ann Priya Sabu and others!) were finding our feet as newly inducted charter members in a brand—new club, the job of designing the bulletin fell into my hands. G.K.Selvaraj uncle, who was instrumental in starting RCCT, gave it the name TOWERS TIMES and asked me to design a logo and masthead. The logo was so basic, with a brush—stroke tower.....and I cringe every time I see it in the archives now! We had a member, Rtn Rajasekhar who was Sabu's neighbour and handled the printing first year. I still remember the thrill of getting the copies of the first bulletin one rainy evening!

It was a single –fold A4 size newsletter. We printed only the masthead for the whole year and printed the inside pages in a single- colour content every month

Annet's corner with their jokes, 'Know your Rotarian' where we featured a Rotarian every month speaking about him/herself, were features everyone looked forward to during the first years. From then on, barring one or two years in between, I think, I must've designed the bulletin for at least about 20 years. This gave me the front—row seat to all the club activities. The vibrancy of our club that dazzles our fellowships the generous and caring spirit that shines through the projects, our involvement in the bigger circle-the district are, all captured month after month.

My journey with Towers Times, from print to digital, has been eventful, to say the least. What started off with 4 sides of an A3-sized paper, folded in the middle, has grown to 30 to 38 pages now.

From designing the bulletin in PageMaker to Corel Draw to Canva the technology and methods have changed and evolved over the years. From just me and an editor then to a full-fledged bulletin team now speaks volumes about the growth of the bulletin.



Thanks to Ann Anuradha, it's such a pleasure to reread old issues every time she shares them in the group!

In 2009, I had the pleasure of designing the GML for the year. It was so lovely to work with the same editor, Sukanya, in 2022 for Rtn Sumedha's Purple Reign, a partners' newsletter for the district. I didn't realize it back then, but over the years, RCCT has given me meaning in life. If not for Rotary, I would have never been exposed to people from other sections of our society, whose lives we could impact with so little effort from us. This gives me a great sense of fulfilment and purpose. This has been reinforced every time I read our bulletin.

Whenever I walk into an RCCT event, be it a fellowship or a speaker meeting, the sense of belonging that washes over me is just awesome. My RCCT. My tribe!
