
Dear RCMers,

Performances:


• Several schools and students performed at the event, showcasing their talents.



WHAT MAKES MRS. OMANA THOMAS AN EXTRAORDINARY EDUCATOR?

Listening to Mrs. Omana Thomas's speech, I was struck by her humility, her love of children, her sense of humor, her tenacity, and her sense of gratitude. It's these kinds of qualities that have helped her build and expand Sishya into the school it is today, and it's these qualities that ensure that Sishyans enjoy their time in school and look back upon it with fondness.

At the beginning of her speech, Omana ma'am shared her own professional journey, which began as an assistant teacher in the kindergarten at Sishya. She later taught middle school Science, and described how much she prepared for each class. Her ability to work her way up from assistant teacher to principal, and her deep respect for every job in a school, is testimony to her humility.

While teaching may be an intense and exhausting profession, it's also a joyful one filled with lots of laughter. Our kids remind us to smile and see the humor in life. Omana entertained the audience by sharing a range of anecdotes describing the comedic exploits of Sishya students, including one about a student who turned the tables and gave her a "yellow card." Omana's stories demonstrate her ability to find humor and joy in the antics of her students, as well as her obvious love of children.





She said, "This is a job that I love, as working with children keeps me young."

As the world changes and evolves, educators too need to grow. Omana described how she completed her B.Ed, after which her daughters exclaimed "Never again!" Yet, soon after that accomplishment, she went on to do an M.Ed. Furthermore, she discussed the massive changes ahead in education as a result of the National Education Policy (NEP), but also added that it remains to be seen whether practice will meet theory.

Finally, Omana thanked her family members and expressed tremendous gratitude towards them. She described how she was inspired by her father-in-law, Kit Thomas, who founded Sishya with a strong desire to create a school that treasures and values childhood. She also paid tribute to her husband, her daughters, and her siblings, describing how they have all helped her on her journey.

Through her insightful and gracious speech, Omana offered all of us Rotarians a glimpse into the kinds of qualities we all need if we want to live extraordinary lives.

CITATION

Mrs. Omana Thomas M.Ed., is a well-known educationist, famed for helming Sishya as its Principal for over twenty years. She has built upon the founding principles of Sishya, a school where childhood is treasured and nurtured. Mrs. Thomas' ability to marry these traditional values with the demanding scholastic expectation of students today, is her unique attribute as an educator.

While the race for marks often dominates, the true purpose of schooling is the skill to imbibe and assimilate knowledge in all its forms. Mrs. Thomas has successfully set a middle ground, introducing an amalgamation of Montessori and traditional teaching methods in junior school. To her students, she is approachable and admired for allowing them space to pursue their passions in sports and extracurricular activities.

She has also been responsible for diversifying her student body by the introduction of a French School, the Ecole Franco-Indienne Sishya within, and has overseen the modernisation of all teaching and learning facilities on campus, keeping a balance of sports and other activities.

Under her watch, students are encouraged to support worthy socially useful causes like education and health initiatives for the underprivileged, instilling in them a sense of empathy. Prioritising the importance of the environment in her students' everyday life, the school is ecologically friendly, with segregation of waste at source, grey water harvesting and the use of solar electricity. Mrs. Thomas has made Sishya's Model United Nations Conference (SISHMUN) an annual event of note, with over 500 students from across schools in Chennai participating every year.

Mrs. Thomas has been invited to attend several international conferences and symposiums, and has been on the Council for the Indian Secondary Certificate Examination (CISCE) Convenorship (2003-2022). She has received the 100 Most Influential Principals of Indian Schools Award from World Education.

Mrs. Omana Thomas has thus achieved what many educators aspire to—make education absorbing, relevant and interesting for every student, eschewing the one-size-fits-all approach. She has set benchmarks in the imparting of quality education, while retaining the ethics and values that make Sishya School different from other institutions of its kind.

On September 5, 2023, on the occasion of Teacher's Day, The Rotary Club of Madras felicitates Mrs. Omana Thomas on all her achievements, and appreciates her innovations and initiatives. She is an inspiration to many, a path-breaker in her work, one who has strived for excellence and keeps abreast of the times.

She is, indeed, Educationist Extraordinaire.

RCM NEW LEARNING & INDUSTRIAL VISITS
SAINT - GOBAIN INDUSTRIAL VISIT - SRIPERUMBUDUR PLANT

AUGUST 26th 2023

Under the New Learning & Industrial visit committee under Chairman Rtn. Rajesh Somasundaram, we had our first Industrial visit on August 26th 2023 to the Saint Gobain plant at Sriperumbudur. This was organized thanks to our Rtn. Bobby Balakrishna.

We had an enthusiastic group of 21 Rotarians who participated.

It was a fantastic trip and we were all mesmerised by the warmth & hospitality of the Saint Gobain team led by Mr Pughazendhi, Mr. Prabhu, Mr. Manikandan, Mr. Hari and a team of 20 members from Saint Gobain.

The visit started off with an introductory video & presentation about the company and the Chennai plant, which is the largest glass plant of Saint Gobain in the world.

We were then given a safety briefing and provided safety shoes, goggles, helmets, and reflective jackets and were taken on buggies to various parts of the plant - mirror line, float glass line and the Security toughened glass line (for automotive) where we got to see how the glass is made, coated, heated, cooled, cut - it was fascinating. Our Rotarians also had great questions. We also planted saplings at the Miyawaki forest that the company maintains on a 7-acre area and has visitors plant saplings.

Mirroring RCM's focus, the company has a specific focus on ensuring they support women, and many women run the assembly lines. Through a program "Gift of Education", they also support 200 students through the NTTF program on their campus by providing scholarships, on the job training and placements. And they are environment friendly having two large rainwater harvesting water bodies which helps them not use groundwater for almost 7 months in a year, a 3.5 MW rooftop solar plant and a Waster heat recovery system to support their energy needs. They also increasingly recycle a lot of glass.

The visit was capped off by Director Rtn. Vijay Balaji proposing a Vote of thanks and President Rtn. Ravi Sundaresan also thanked the Saint Gobain team for hosting us. This was followed by

a delicious lunch hosted by them at the Fairfield by Marriott hotel nearby.

Overall, a superb start to the year and we look forward to more such Industrial visits that the committee is planning.

A big shout out to Rtn. Bobby for helping us with the permissions and to Chairman Rtn. Rajesh Somasundaram and team for organising the visit. A big thank you to Honorary Secretary Rtn. Seshasai for organising the Volvo bus and the snacks that made the travel so comfortable and finally, a big thank you to the energetic group of 21 Rotarians for their enthusiasm that made this visit a Grand Success.

AHISTORY ON HOW THE INCS CAME ABOUT

The first fireside meeting of the Club was held on August 9, 1966, at the residence of Rtn. M. Ct. Muthiah.

It was a success but the concept still needed boosting.

The September 20, 1966 issue of The Light House carried an explanation of what fireside meetings were:

"A Fireside meeting is an informal gathering of a group of Rotarians in the home of a Club member to develop acquaintance and to learn more about Rotary.

Many clubs have found such meetings to be particularly effective for keeping the membership up-todate on Rotary and in providing Rotary information to new members as a means of assimilating them into the club."

In the same issue, the 'In A Lighter Vein' column had this to say on the topic: "At first, the thought of Fireside meetings might seem repulsive to many, what with so much heat generated in every walk of life in the country and especially in the sweltering, humid city of Madras. Noneless, the idea is quite commendable provided the rendezvous takes place in the surroundings of a buttery bar or some such similar haunt, where thirst is quenched, tongues loosened, minds cleared and appetite satisfied.

Many useful suggestions will come forth, work accomplished and lifelong friends made.

If the above fails, God help the President or have fire-ing meetings."

Whether the humorous approach helped the idea along is not known but by 1971, fireside meetings were a well-organised affairs with a group of about 21, each under the chairmanship of a member of the Fireside Committee.
